† Affirmation of Faith From the Second Helvetic Confession Elizabeth Small Baptism was instituted and consecrated by God. First John baptized, who dipped Christ in the water in Jordan. From him it came to the apostles, who also baptized with water. The Lord expressly commanded them to preach the Gospel and to baptize "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." And later, Peter said to the Jews who inquired what they ought to do: "Be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Hence by some baptism is called a sign of initiation for God's people, since by it the elect of God are consecrated to God. There is but one baptism in the church of God; and it is sufficient to be once baptized or consecrated unto God. For baptism once received continues for all of life, and is a perpetual sealing of our adoption.

The Second Helvetic Confession was written in 1562 as a confession of faith for Reformed churches in Switzerland. By 1600, the confession had been adopted by most Reformed churches in Europe.
