Happy Spring!

It feels so good to write that. As I write this, my window is open and I can hear the birds singing, which always makes me happy. Soon I will hear the hoots of the owl that lives in my neighborhood and the sound of the cicadas. It is music to my ears!

I want to share with you some of the things that have been happening the last couple of months as well as some plans as we move forward during this interim time. As I shared with the Session at the retreat in January (the weekend after my arrival the previous Tuesday), the interim time isn't just about maintenance; it is about discerning and working together to put this church in the best position possible as we look forward to the next season of this church's life.

At the January Session retreat, the Session identified a significant number of actions it plans to pursue over the coming months. Some of those follow along with the progress that has been made thus far.

- 1) Redefine and document the purpose and role of each ministry of the Session and the volunteer/service opportunities available through each ministry with the aim of fully involving the church family in MVPC's ministries.
 - Progress: I have met with the elders of each Ministry Team and we have identified the functions of each Ministry Team and tasks needed to fulfill those functions as well as discussed new ideas for the Session ministries. This information will be used to develop a Time and Talent form and we will launch a Time and Talent Campaign this spring to give the church family the opportunity to share with the elders the ways in which you wish to serve and support the different ministries of MVPC.

2) Study and make recommendations regarding MVPC's current worship schedule. Progress: The Session has appointed a Task Force that will report to the Session by its August meeting.

3) Develop a systematic approach to welcoming and following up with visitors.

Progress: The Witness Ministry is working with our Membership Coordinator staff member. Lauren McClintock, and me to ensure all first-time visitors are greeted when they attend worship and contacted immediately following. Also, a membership inquiry class is in the works for people who may be interested in becoming members of MVPC.

4) Several actions involve Christian Education, including diversifying adult Sunday School offerings, identifying other Christian Education opportunities beyond Sunday School, and the creation of short-term (4-6 week) small groups. In Christian Education, we also want to focus particularly on one of the top priorities identified in the Church Assessment Tool church-wide survey that was completed in January of 2017: attracting families with young children.

Progress: At the March meeting of the Session, the Session voted to change the existing (and currently unfilled) staff position of Director of Children's Ministries to a comprehensive staff person for Christian Education. We will now begin the process of creating that job description and searching for someone to fill that staff position (20-30 hours per week). The Session and I are most grateful to Carrie Southard who has been volunteering in as the Director of Children's Ministries while that staff position has been vacant.
