# Christian Education—Children

## Children In Worship

We have some new worship resources available for children who are attending either worship service. Parents with children can pick up a Children's Worship Packet before entering the sanctuary. They are located under the bulletin board in the alcove of the narthex. These packets are geared to elementary age (1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>) and preschool children (3's-K). They enable children to have a more enjoyable time by engaging them in kid friendly activities (drawing, Bible puzzles/stories, Bible coloring pages, etc.) when there are portions of the worship service where they might get bored and restless (ex. sermon time). Please return them after worship ends.

Also, there is a new brochure available for all adults and parents of children which has helpful hints on how we welcome children into worship. It is available on the resource table in the narthex.

This Fall children who are in 1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grades will remain in worship during the entire service. Child care is available in room 120 for children through kindergarten age. Parents of preschool children can take them to as much of the worship service as they desire and then return them to the nursery area. Elementary age children should not be left in the nursery during worship due to safety concerns.





# **Christian Education**

## Sunday Church School Classes

## Monday Bible Study

There is a great opportunity for adults to increase their Biblical knowledge by joining the 10:00 Monday Bible study hosted by Bob Addison. It is a good time to reflect, discuss, and grow spiritually as you gain new understanding of the scriptures.

There will be a 4 week session starting Monday, September 10th at 10:00 in the Session Room called: A Brief Survey of the New Testament by Mark Strauss. There are four, 20 minute DVD lessons listen to scripture, presented by Strauss followed by class discussion on what he has said and what we have read in the Bible. The author provides an overview of the Bible's key themes, shows what the teachings meant to the people at the time, and explains how these teachings apply to us today.

This will carry the class until October 1st and then we will begin another study starting October 8th - TBA.



# Session Synopsis

At the August 19, 2018 Stated Meeting of the MVPC Session, the following occurred:

- Received the results of the P.A.C.E. Christian Education Survey in which the Session participated. The P.A.C.E. CE Survey was created by Director of Christian Education, Mike Gillespie, to evaluate MVPC's current Christian Education program across all ages and stages of life.
- Received an update from the Pastor Nominating Committee that listening sessions with the congregation are being conducted. Feedback will be used in creating the MVPC Ministry Information Form for the pastoral search.
- Highlights of Session Ministry reports:
  - Addition of an adult Sunday School Class.

Renewed interest in MVPC having a Stephen Ministry program.
Renovation of the Kirk Center is nearing completion. Remaining funds to be raised for the project are approximately \$30,000.

Thanksgiving for the work Wendy Hagenau and Ann Addison for their leadership of MVPC's participation in the Family Promise program since its inception here at MVPC.

- Efforts in progress to enhance a welcoming environment at MVPC.
- Worship leadership space has been moved closer to the congregation.

• The Worship Task Force is asking the congregation for feedback via a survey through mid-September.

• The Young Adult Task Force continues to explore meaningful ways to engage younger members of MVPC.

The following motions were approved by the Session:

 Approved a motion from the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation to contribute \$1,500 a year for 5 years to the MVPS Pioneer Tomorrow Fund.

• Approved a motion from the Finance & Administration Ministry to contribute \$1,500 a year for 5 years from the MVPC operating budget to the MVPS Pioneer Tomorrow Fund.

 Approved the following motions from the Strategic Planning Ministry:

• Document each ministry team's purpose and responsibilities and maintain notes and minutes to facilitate efficiency and smoother transitions as Session members rotate on and off Session.

• Session members will increase their focus on enlisting volunteers to support their ministry team.

• Create a Christian Education Ministry to include an elder for Adult Education and an elder for Children's Ministry (thus including the current Children's Ministry under the Christian Education Ministry) and a MVPC member to represent the youth.

# Session Synopsis Continued...

• Rename the Adult Ministry to Senior Adult Ministry.

• Create a Personnel Subcommittee, chaired by an elder, under the Finance and Administration Ministry umbrella.

• Rename the Intergenerational Ministry to Fellowship Ministry.

• Set the number of elders serving on the Session each year to 15 + 1 youth-aged elder for a total of 16 elders on Session.

• Institute a new process for assigning elders to Session Ministry Positions.
