One: We feel peace in beautiful moments: In moments when we hold hands around the table for grace, or when we laugh with siblings at our shared memories; In moments that we as a church share, when we baptize babies or when we sing in harmony; In moments when we hear God say again in scripture, "One day every valley will be lifted up," and "Darkness did not overcome the light."

The lighting of the Advent wreath is a relatively new practice in Christian worship. During Advent, children at the mission school Rauhes Haus, founded by Johann Hinrich Wichern in Hamburg, would ask daily if Christmas had arrived. In 1839, he built a large wooden ring (made out of an old cartwheel) with 20 small red and 4 large white candles. A small candle was lit successively
