Your Stephen Ministers have completed fifty hours of initial training and are being commissioned for service on July 7. They add another layer to our congregational care plan. Stephen Ministers are equipped to meet with people suffering from all kinds of losses (grief, illness, job change, moving, transitional issues) and long-term illness, dying, loneliness, and spiritual questioning.

Training does not end at commissioning. Your Stephen Ministers will continue learning new ways to care for specific issues over the year and will be participating in a supervision group every month to insure quality care for each referral. All information is confidential, and Stephen Ministers will not know names or details of each other's care receivers, only the nature of the care being offered.

To maintain confidentiality, all referrals go to the pastors, then the Stephen Leader, who meets with the care receiver to explain the program and matches the care receiver with a Stephen Minister. The one-on-one relationship begins quickly thereafter and lasts until the issues lighten with weekly contact.

No one at MVPC should ever feel they walk alone. Stephen Ministers are trained to help share those burdens.

Session Synopsis

From May 19, 2019 Stated Meeting of the MVPC Session

- Due to the Memorial Service for Tom Hughes at 3 p.m. that afternoon, the Session had a shortened agenda.
- Approved a request from the Pastor Nominating Committee to call a meeting of the congregation to receive its report and vote on the PNC's candidate for MVPC's next installed pastor.
- Fellowship Ministry reported the Cinco de Mayo Celebration on the afternoon of May 5 at the home of David and Debbie Barclift was a huge success with multiple generations present. The next Fellowship event is the Summer Celebration/Pentecost Cookout on June 9 following the 10 a.m. service in the courtyard.
- Outreach Ministry reported that Gill Hutt, Outreach elder, will be going to Zambia in the early fall to represent MVPC and visit with the Garden Presbyterian School.
- Witness Ministry will be working on updating the MVPC active roll and make recommendations regarding removals at either the June or July Session meeting.
- Worship Ministry reported the Holy Week and Easter worship services were all well attended. The combined worship service at 10 a.m. will begin Memorial Weekend and continue through Labor Day Weekend. We will resume two services on September 8.
- Christian Education Ministry reported there will be two summer outings for children: June 8 is an outing to Rise Equestrian and June 29 at the Dunwoody Nature Center for a hike and painting with MVPC artist, Donna Martin. CE also reported there were mostly positive responses concerning the Lenten small groups. There will be another series of small groups from September 15 – October 13 and CE will be discussing the topics for that series at its next meeting. The Fellowship of the Carpenter (Men's Group) will meet on June 30 from 8:30-9:45. CE is also in the process of updating MVPC's child protection policy.
- Congregation Care Ministry reported it has received very positive feedback concerning the recently instituted email Prayervine. Joys and concerns can be shared with the Prayervine by emailing: Prayerrequests@MVPchurch.org. Elizabeth Small continues to serve the Congregational Care Ministry in her role as Interim Director of Congregational Care. Please contact Elizabeth at Elizabeth@mvpchurch.org if there is a need for pastoral support.
- Finance/Administration Ministry reported MVPC is slightly ahead of budget from a revenue perspective and slightly under budget from an expense perspective. FAMT reported that Won-Hee An's resignation as MVPC Organist/Accompanist has been accepted and Won-Hee will receive her monthly salary for the month of May but will not be playing at worship services. The Session approved FAMT's motion to move Interim Music Director Matthias Young from 25 hours per week to 30. The Session approved the procedure presented by FAMT for the purposes of searching for an Organist/Accompanist. The Session approved the request from the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation regarding its recommendations for 2019 grant recipients.

- The Young Adult Task Force reported there will be an outing at the upcoming Renaissance Festival.
- Elder commissioners to the May 4 meeting of the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta shared with the Session their reflections from the meeting.
- Interim Pastor Susan Haynes distributed two articles to the Session, one concerning the results of a study that found children who are raised in a religious or spiritual environment are better protected from depression, substance abuse, and other risky behaviors and copies of the PCUSA Book of Order regarding the duties and responsibilities of Ruling Elders and the Session.
- Prayers of Intercession and Thanksgiving and How We Have Seen God at Work Among Us were shared by those elders serving as meeting observers.

The Christian education committee is currently in the editing stage of our new Children & Youth Protection Policy. They hope to have it ready for Session review soon. When finally adopted by the Session, this new policy will be more comprehensive than our previous one and allow us take a more proactive approach in protecting our children and youth when they are in our care.

SMALL GROUPS RETURNING SEPTEMBER 15

The C.E. committee wants to give everyone a heads-up about our next scheduled round of small group meetings. Our Lenten groups were very successful and we hope to expand from 4 groups to 5. *Small groups will meet weekly for a 5-week session from September 15 – October 13.*

We are in the process of reviewing potential studies for these groups and those topics will be announced in the August newsletter. Current plans are to structure our next round of small groups around different topics instead of having every group study the same one. We hope this will encourage more people to participate. Also, the groups will again be scheduled at different times and places to allow the greatest opportunity for people to join.

So, get ready to have another great experience in a small group. These gatherings for study, prayer, and fellowship are indeed special.

SUMMER ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

Need a spiritual tune-up? Join our **Feasting On the Word** class that meets from 11-12 each Sunday morning in the Chapel! It's a good way to strengthen flabby spiritual muscles.

Each Sunday we explore the lectionary passage of the week using the following four-fold approach to perk class discussion.

WHAT? Basic information about backgrounds and meanings of Scripture is essential to understanding. This section asks "What?" are the important things to know about the contexts, language, and settings of the biblical passage.

WHERE? To understand the meanings of passages, we also need to ask "Where?" Where is God in this passage? Where are God's will and activities being expressed? These theological questions about where God's word comes to us in the passage are significant.

SO WHAT? The implications of the passage for our Christian lives make the biblical passage come alive. We ask, "So what?" What does this passage mean to me? What does it mean for my relationship with God and other people?

NOW WHAT? Biblical passages shape our understanding of the church and how we live in the world, connecting us to the needs of others and to God's will for us. So we ask, "Now what?" This prompts us to reflect on how we—and the church—can live out what the passage is saying.

Teachers rotating leadership this summer include David Hill, Sam McClurg, Pat Davis, Pearl Attaway, and Mike Gillespie.

QUEST CLASS REVIEW

QUEST, our newest Sunday morning adult class finished up its studies in May. Every week found the group generating energetic discussion and conversation around a variety of spiritually empowering topics.

Quest will return September 8 and plunge into a lively discussion of Antonin Scalia's book, *ON FAITH*. Pick up a copy this summer and read it. This book will definitely get your juices flowing as we delve into this giant man of faith who left a lasting legacy on the Supreme Court. Conversations around this book will help us clarify and define our own faith positions when it comes to what the framers of the constitution wanted us to understand about "the separation of church and state."

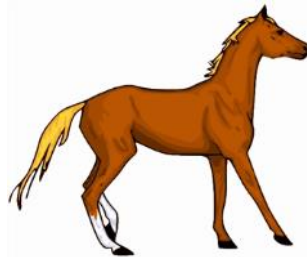

Family Promise of North Fulton DeKalb works to provide shelter and sustenance to families who for a variety of reasons find themselves homeless. We are able to provide this service in partnership with a group of 14 congregations of different denominations in our area. Some provide physical shelter, some are support churches who although their campus is not suitable for the families to sleep in, share organizational support, financial support, meals, and, of course volunteers.

Volunteer opportunities include being a host as the families return from work and school to have dinner. In many congregations families all come together to be hosts. Each evening volunteers provide meals for our Families and volunteers, either home cooked or delivered from a local restaurant. Others sleep overnight and help with breakfasts.

Aside from spending time with the families we need volunteers to set up and break down the rooms, do the laundry, and provide Target gift cards (for any supply needs throughout the weeks) foodstuffs and toiletries. We also ask for volunteers to provide gift cards, for the Regal Movie Theater and for Stars and Strikes.
