### **Session Report**

The Session of Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church met for their annual retreat on January 24–25 at the Calvin Center south of Atlanta. Much of the time was spent in reflection on the year that was and brainstorming for the year ahead. In the course of this discernment, the Session did hold their formal meeting.

On Friday night, Elders-elect Bryce Cumming, Brent Schweiger, Carol Beckman, John Hibbard, Mary Kilgore, Wendy Hagenau, and David Hill all read aloud their statements of faith to the entire body. Following a time of questions by the current elders, a motion to accept the Elders-Elect was sustained.

Following an adjournment, the Session formally reconvened on Saturday afternoon to resume the meeting.

Session members were encouraged to sign-up for various duties such as: attending quarterly meetings of the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta and serving monthly communion.

Session then approved the consent agenda which included approving: the previous meeting minutes; dates to serve Holy Communion in 2020; dates to hold Quarterly Team Meetings; the elder ministry team assignments; the monthly outreach and special offerings; David Hill to serve as clerk of session; Steve Ray to serve as treasurer; John Hibbard, Mary Kilgore, and Donna Martin to attend February 8<sup>th</sup> Presbytery Meeting at Alpharetta Presbyterian Church.

Following the unison Affirmation of Faith from the Second Helvetic Confession, session engaged in the following business:

Elected Charlie Gray, Chair and Carrie Southard, Vice-Chair of the Church Nominating Committee.

Elder John Hibbard reviewed the 2019 financials and went through the 2020 budget that Finance/Administration Team brought before the session. Session approved the 2020 operating budget as presented. Approved the 2019 statistical report presented by Elder David Hill to be sent to the PC(USA) national office.

Rev. Abernethy gave a report on the Organist Search and upon request from the Search Committee presented Justin Maxey as the finalist for the position. Rev. Abernethy shared that Mr. Maxey comes to Mount Vernon after previously serving as the organist at Roswell Presbyterian Church. Session approved the recommendation. Mr. Maxey's first Sunday will be February 16<sup>th</sup>.

Elder David Barclift reported that the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) is starting to meet and hopes to have the Ministry Information Form (MIF) online soon. A MIF is the church equivalent of a resume for pastors to read and learn more about our church.

Rev. Abernethy offered his pastor's report which included the following: he will meet with students who are completing coursework at Austin Seminary and share with them more about our open Associate Pastor position; he is talking with Columbia Theological Seminary to discuss ideas about fostering an internship program between the church and a seminary student; working with Congregational Care to ensure MVPC pastoral care needs are being met; he is trying to be visible in the community through offering prayers at Sandy Springs City Council meetings and teaching Mount Vernon School elementary students about Advent and Epiphany.

Rev. Abernethy closed the meeting with prayer and the retreat ended with a brief service where the sacrament of Holy Communion was administered.

It was all perfect, and exactly what I hoped it would be. Having Rick Sommers show up (much to my surprise) was extra special since he's the one who hired me. I enjoyed seeing people from all the different eras of MVPC and catching up with former youth. I felt celebrated and special. So thank you to everyone who planned it (especially Steve Ray, David Barclift, Yvonne White and Barrett Abernethy), those who came, the youth who served, and those who were there in spirit. Thank you also for the love offering.

I have loved this church deeply for almost 22 years. I have loved the energy there and the weird shape of the sanctuary. I have loved going to Honduras, Raleigh, Florida, Kentucky, Memphis, Asheville, Chicago, King College and more, all with groups of teens and brave adults. Those trips have given me memories that I will always treasure. I've loved doing skits that made a point (LEGO Challenge or Yuk the Y2KBug, anyone?) and leading Youth Sunday services (while keeping students from rappelling down from the overhead skylight). I've loved leading Youth Group, teaching Sunday School and Confirmation, and speaking to various groups. I've loved doing outreach programs here in Atlanta, especially our Feed the Homeless program that the teens and I started in 2002. I've loved starting Cakes4Kids at Lake Forest, hanging with the staff and laughing with them while admiring their gifts, being in the Praise Band from the very beginning, getting to know our Senior members, who told me hilarious and moving stories of their lives, playing games with those seniors and sharing meals with them, and being a part of our services and worship times. Honestly, there were very few Sundays that I didn't drive home thinking how blessed I was to be at MV.

But most of all I have loved *you*. All of you. You've shared your wisdom and ideas with me. You've shared your hearts and let me share mine. You've let me preach creative and different sermons like singing a "Hamilton" song, giving out Oscars on a red carpet (and getting to win one at both services – best day ever!!) or showing you my lovely 5th grade picture. You've shared your teens and your Senior adults freely with me. I know that both groups have taught me way more than I taught them. The outpouring of love and support you offered when my mom and dad died still just stuns me and fills my heart. (In the words of the immortal Milt Hibbard, "how do people manage loss when they don't have a church?") You have taught me, you have encouraged me, you have BEEN the church for me. And I don't have the words to adequately tell you how much I have loved it all. I couldn't love all of you more or be more grateful for my time here. I really did love it all.

I ended a note on social media that seems appropriate here, so I'm using it again. In the words of that great philosopher Winnie the Pooh: "How lucky I am to have something that makes saying goodbye so hard."
