

Dear Mount Vernon Family,

Back in March when your Church Session made the difficult decision to suspend in-person worship, I began the letter by sharing a quote from Presbyterian Pastor William Sloane Coffin, "The world is too dangerous for anything but truth and too small for anything but love." As much as life has changed since I first offered you those words, their meaning rings just as true as they did then.

Here is the truth: over the past several weeks, your Worship Ministry Team has thoughtfully and compassionately discerned what a process for reimagining worship in this new normal might look like. These discussions have been honest, raw, and laborious. We have asked difficult questions of what worship can and cannot look like and admittedly, at times, have lamented at some of the procedures we will strongly encourage you to adhere to in the worship setting. Through it all, however, we have enthusiastically shared our hopes for connecting and finding community in a myriad of ways for the present as well as going forward.

At this time, we don't have any concrete processes in place. We believe to give you such a document would be futile because we are constantly gleaning new information about what a safe and socially responsible worship service would look like. Rest assured though that we are heeding the guidance of public health experts and the scientific community. We are pleased that the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta has come out with their suggestions to support faith communities. We will look to this document for inspiration when we formally compose our procedures. Please feel free to access that document here (link).

Here is the love: each of you are a child of God. As of this writing, I have reached out to more than 150 households within our faith community. That does not include the emails, text messages, and social media interactions I have had with you since this all began. Through these connections, I have listened to your voices as we have laughed, cried, expressed angst, and prayed together. I have heard your longing to gather, but also a desire to gather in a manner that values health and well-being first and foremost. Thank you for living the gospel truth in love to serve the least of these. For while the world wrestles with when to open as largely a question of economic viability, we in the church must examine this question from a moral perspective. That is why our answers must be based in love.

For the past several weeks we have had your previous pastors conclude on our online worship services with a few words of encouragement. It has been a joy to see each of these faithful people reconnect with you in the manner they once did. What has linked these messages has been the expression of gladness they each revealed. You could tell how their experiences at Mount Vernon molded the hearts of these clergy and the way that still influences them today. This pandemic will mark our collective ministry together. No matter how long this season lasts or how long I am here as your pastor, I believe this will define our relationship. As such, I want you to see the values I bring to this relationship are based in truth and love, and when the time comes for us to share more details about what our return to physical worship looks like, you will know that we stand together.

### Benefits from the CARES Act for Charitable Giving, and an Update on the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation Covid-19 Relief Fund

As you may already know, the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation recently created a Covid-19 Relief Fund to provide an avenue for church members to give much needed charitable support to those in need as a result of the current Pandemic.

Whether you have already made a charitable contribution in 2020, are thinking about making additional contributions or are contributing for the first time, there is some positive tax benefit news to share. To encourage charitable giving during this extreme time of need, the CARES Act has made a tax deduction available to taxpayers who claim the standard deduction and otherwise do not get a tax benefit from their charitable giving. The deduction is for any qualifying contributions in 2020 up to \$300 per taxpayer or \$600 for a married couple filing a joint return. So, from a tax standpoint, 2020 can be a great time to give!

In addition to this special feature provided by the CARES Act, it is always a good time to point out a special tax provision that exists for persons 70 1/2 or older to give charitable contributions directly from their IRA. This can be a very income tax advantaged way to contribute that can also lead to Medicare premium savings in certain cases. If you think this may apply to you, we strongly encourage you to discuss this further with your tax advisor.

Of course, these tax advantages apply to both your regular contributions to Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church and to the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation.

#### **COVID 19 FUND UPDATE**

Thanks to the generosity of the Mount Vernon congregation, a total of \$16,660 has been donated to the COVID 19 Fund as of May 19. Task Force members Christy Hill, Jeanne Mielke, and Carol Beckman have contacted leaders of our ministry partners and have prayerfully considered how we can help meet the sometimes overwhelming needs due to the pandemic.

In the past two weeks, the following funds have been distributed:

- \$4,000 to the Community Assistance Center (CAC) to provide food for vulnerable families in our community.
- \$3,000 to Family Promise of North Fulton/DeKalb for additional expenses due to "sheltering in place" since mid-March at St. Luke's Presbyterian Church.
- \$1,500 to Alliance for Children Everywhere to purchase infrared thermometers and other medical supplies for the House of Moses and the Bill and Betty Bryant Home for at-risk children in Zambia.
- \$2,000 to Los Ninos Primero to purchase academic materials necessary for at-home learning due to the cancellation of the fourweek summer program at MVPC.
- \$800 to Garden Presbyterian Church and School, Zambia, to provide assistance to teachers, students, and vulnerable families of our sister congregation.
- \$500 to Stirred Up Ministries for assistance to at-risk youth and their families in the East Lake area of Atlanta
- \$500 to International Women's House for food and other supplies for abused women and children "sheltering in place".

#### **May Session Report**

The Session of Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church met virtually for their May monthly meeting on Sunday, May 17, 2020.

The meeting began at 12:30pm with an opening prayer by Rev. Barrett Abernethy, Moderator.

Clerk of Session, David Hill reported that all elders were in attendance.

Elder Dale Morine then offered the devotional inviting us to remember that God doesn't change, but God can change us.

Clerk Hill noted the dates and times of future Presbytery meetings for the rest of the calendar year. He also made the body aware of an acknowledgement of gratitude from the Atlanta Ministry with International Students (AMIS).

Session then approved the minutes of the previous meetings and Rev. Abernethy led everyone in an Affirmation of Faith by offering a Taize Song titled "Bless the Lord."

#### **Ministry Team Reports**

Elder Carrie Southard gave the Christian Education report and informed the body that Zoom calls for children are being set up, and that Rev. Abernethy will teach a class titled Presbyterian 101 beginning June 7<sup>th</sup>.

Elder Joy Carden shared the Congregational Care report and thanked elders and others for their diligent efforts in reaching out to church members and visitors to keep a sense of connection at this time.

Elder David Barclift offered the Fellowship report. He is working on potential ideas via Zoom due to the need to social distance.

Elders Charlie Gray and Wit Truitt offered the Finance/ Administration report. They also welcomed Glenn Grove from the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation who updated us on needed by-laws changes. The Foundation was able to give \$35,000 this year to various entities. To date, stewardship is strong, and Elders Gray and Truitt were thankful for the generosity of church members. They also noted that to date, the COVID-19 fund established has raised around \$22,000.

Elders Brent Schweiger and Carol Beckman reported that the Outreach Team continues to respond to immediate needs caused by the pandemic. Please see elsewhere in the newsletter for a full accounting of how many has been dispersed by our COVID-19 Task Force.

Elder Mary Kilgore reported that Senior Adults are continuing to stay connected to one another during this time.

Elders John Hibbard and MacKenzie Truitt shared the Witness report. They noted we had 2 member deaths and received word that 2 members had joined Shallowford Presbyterian last fall. It was also mentioned from Elder Truitt that the Young Adults would be holding a Zoom gathering in the near future.

Elders Wendy Hagenau and Dale Morine gave the Worship report. They noted the hard work the team has been doing to consider the way in which we "reopen" for corporate worship. They stated that while several ideas have been considered that no dates or policies have been put in place. They have asked Rev. Abernethy to work on composing a letter that details where we are as a congregation and then later when we are closer to a formal date for returning to worship, send a second letter to the congregation detailing what worship could look like.

Elders Jon Barber and Bryce Cumming gave the Youth report. They updated the body on hopeful August mission trip plans as well as the recent basketball gathering that took place via Zoom.

Elder David Barclift updated the body of the Associate Pastor Search. He noted the Committee has interviewed candidates that they are excited about and are planning further interviews with candidates.

The Session then had a discussion regarding the reopening of Mount Vernon Presbyterian School for the fall semester. Rev. Abernethy, Clerk Hill, and Elder Gray reported they had met with School officials this past Thursday, May 14<sup>th</sup> and that the School is clearly trying to ensure the utmost safety and well-being of all who come onto the church campus for school related matters. The School has agreed to refrain from using the Sanctuary, Choir Room, Chapel, Session Room, and Gailey Hall for the time being. Both parties will continue to work with each other throughout this process due to the fluid nature of this situation. A motion to approve the School to return to the MVPC facilities was approved.

Rev. Abernethy then gave his report. He noted that since March 15th he has called 141 member households and had further contact with parishioners and known visitors via social media, emails, text messages, and handwritten notes. He further shared ideas for June worship services, other connectional/worship opportunities for the congregation, and updated the body on his pursuit to start a Doctor of Ministry at Columbia Seminary.

Elders Hill, Southard, and Barber then offered brief reflections of the May Presbytery Meeting that was held virtually.

Rev. Abernethy then closed the meeting in prayer.


## Volunteers Needed Once Services Resume Normal Business Hours

Now, into the long, uncertain season of waiting for a vaccine, many who were stalwart during heavy quarantine find themselves feeling uneasy going out into society again. Some have had the double whammy of job loss or financial loss to add to their concern. How does one quell anxiety?

\*If Returning To Work, Be Proactive Know the laws and rules and follow them. Wear a mask for every person to person interaction and hold others accountable, as well. Bring a lunch and find a peaceful outdoor spot to enjoy it. What you do now affects others at work and when you come home.

\*Use Self-Calming Techniques
Remember that it is hard for anxiety and calm to live
together. Invite calm by Deep breathing (Inhale, with your
stomach extended if possible, do a slow count of three,
hold that breath for three, and slowly exhale for
three. Repeat about five times.)

\*Negate Unproductive Thoughts
Make a list of your worries. Make a second list in two
columns of what you can control and what you cannot
control and put your worries in those columns. Release the
ones you can't control.

#### \*Avoid Overload Of News/Information

Fill your life with positivity. Plan a once a day news viewing and minimize online access. Concentrate on things you can do to improve your outlook.

#### \*Declutter

Too much stuff and the procrastination to deal with it, creates anxiety. A cleaner, neater environment brings joy.

#### \*Ask For Support

Call a parent or trusted friend and share your feelings. We all have feelings about what's happening. Keep a diary. Contact your minister, Stephen Ministry, or a counselor if things are spinning out of control.

#### \*Move Your Body

Movement increases endorphins and raises spirits. If you move outdoors, your prospects are heightened by drinking in the natural world's gifts of joy, tranquility, and vitamin D.

#### \*Seek Spiritual Guidance

Read scriptures that tell of God's promises and protection. Pray for others as well as yourself.

#### \*Put The Focus On Others



Maritza Morelli earned her bachelor's degree in special education and her master's degree in child psychology in her native Venezuela and spent seven years there working for the Department of Education researching the ways in which children learn to read and write: and

Maritza came to the United States 30 years ago and spent 2 years as a family interpreter for Northside Hospital and 15 years as the lead bilingual community liaison for Fulton County Schools where she met and assisted Latino families in understanding and navigating the public school system; and

Maritza's steadfast work and determination was noticed by Pastor Rick Simmons at Mt. Vernon Presbyterian Church and she was recruited to head a new and inspirational project called Los Niños Primero; and
