Good Morning, Mount Vernon. We are delighted once again to celebrate worship with you. Today is a special day as we lift up mothers and those who have played a mothering role as well as the 9 high school seniors affiliated with this church. Already and throughout this service you will hear from these students and their mothers as together we give thanks to God for their work so that we can envision hope for generations to come.

Plan for Going Forward

As I told you last Sunday, our Worship Ministry Team met this past Wednesday and directed me to work with our staff to develop a letter detailing what an initial plan of action for returning to corporate worship could look like. This coming week, this letter will be vetted and revised by first, the Worship Team, and then the entire Session. It is not exhaustive, but rather a guide as to what returning to worship, at least in the near term, could look like. When is that near term? As I said last week. I don't know. We will be informed by the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, who shall lead us through the expertise of public health officials, the wisdom of fellow clergy and church leaders, as well as what we hear from you, our members. I want you to know we are also thinking of creative ways to further reach out and support you, our community.

Opportunities this Week

A couple of ways we are trying to connect virtually will take place over the next week. On Wednesday night at 7pm, we will hold our first Taize service via Zoom. This is a service meant for healing and wholeness and incorporates song, scripture, and silence. There will also be a time for you to offer prayer concerns. For this first service, I will walk you through the service and depending on demand we may begin to offer this service more frequently.

Next Sunday at 9:45am, we will hold our Quarterly Team Meetings via Zoom as well. All teams will be invited to join in and then we will send you to virtual breakout rooms to conduct your business. At 10:45am. We will conclude the meeting but will invite you to stay on and we will watch the service together at 11am in a sort of virtual congregation. I know that sounds like a lot, and yes, some of it is even over my head, but we are going to try it. Then at 12:30pm your Session will gather for its May meeting.

COVID Fund Update
