Family of two, dining out in a nice restaurant just once = Saving \$50 - \$200




Family of 4 attending a Braves game = Saving \$125 - \$350

Fall 2020 Small Group Sign-ups!

Small groups begin Sunday, September 27th and continue for 6 weeks with the last meeting being on November 1st. Here is what you need to know:

What if I was not in a group in the spring and want to sign-up for a group? Please contact David Hill by phone or email (678-274-8878 or david.hill321@comcast.net). David will give you information about the groups and put you in touch with the group leader of your choice.

What if I was in a group in the spring? You will remain in the same group — contact that group's leader and let them know you will be participating since group size is limited.

What if I want to change groups? Contact David Hill who will put you in touch with another group leader. Group size is limited to 15.

What will we study during this fall session? The Christian Education Committee has discussed curricula options; the committee and small group leaders all want to explore the issues surrounding social justice that we are currently grappling with as a nation. PCUSA has developed curriculum materials on this subject that are available on the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta website. This means there will be no charge for books. Participants will be able to download their own materials or stop by the church to pick-up printed copies. We will announce details on how to do this.

Where will groups meet? Each group will make its own decision regarding meeting locations. There are two options:



Hold ZOOM meetings

Groups of 15 or less to meet at a location on the church campus outside of school hours (one single group could meet in a designated location during school hours). Groups that choose the church campus option will follow strict guidelines approved by Session that include wearing masks and maintaining a safe distance from one another.

At this time small groups will not meet in homes.

Are there any other days when groups will meet besides Sundays? Groups can change when they meet as long as they adhere to the following:

Groups desiring to meet on a different day of the week using ZOOM meetings will simply need to notify David Hill of the change and will need to schedule the appropriate meeting times with the church office.

Groups desiring to meet on a different day of the week on the church campus (outside of school hours) would need to notify David Hill AND schedule the time and location with the church office.



Celebrating the Stuff

Earlier this month as I was helping my parents move into their new home in Sandy Springs, my mother and I had the following exchange amid the towers of boxes that made their living room look like Lower Manhattan;

"What are you all going to do with this stuff?"

"I guess your generation doesn't collect like we did."

After pondering it, I told my mother that I agreed, to an extent. While we don't amass the volume of stuff, we are very materialistic. We just have collapsed our materialism into our phones.

Boxes of photos... on our phone.

Old letters... in our email.

Books... on our tablets.

Yet, on the other hand, I believe my question to my mother was a bit harsh. After all, that "stuff" is a cue and in this season where we are isolated and under stimulated because we are staring at the same screen day after day, the stuff can be what reminds us of that which is comforting, reliable, and hopeful. The trinket from our travels, the photo that used to sit on grandfather's mantle, the frayed puzzle that suddenly has value once again.

Stuff can remind us of the times we intentionally came together to make a memory, to celebrate time, to acknowledge new life. The stuff itself is not spiritual, but it can point us to the spiritual. In this season of alienation and frayed mental states, we at Mount Vernon have tried to celebrate the visual cues we find in worship, which is ironic, because the reformers explicitly denounced iconography when they broke from Rome 500 years. I do wonder what Calvin and Zwingli would have thought of Zoom worship.

You see we need the stuff right now. We need the cameras to catch different angles. We need the words to be said in different places. Because while the church is the people, the people find solace in the church. It has the stuff- the font, the table, the pulpit, the cross, the stained glass, the architecture- that comes together to celebrate the grandeur, the wonder, the small, and the visible signs of an invisible love. And when we're apart we need to see those cues, for that is what will stimulate that Word and embody that sacrament.

I told my Mom I am not sure what I am going to do with all that stuff when the time comes, but I told her not to get rid of it, yet. Because right now, we need the cues that constantly reorient us to the rhythm of Christ.

Zambia College Program

Seven years ago we established the Zambia College Scholarship fund for deserving students. These students must have successfully completed high school, be very bright, motivated, and demonstrate extreme financial need. Since its inception, the fund has provided college scholarships which enabled 6 students to graduate in '17, '18, '19. Currently, 9 students are enrolled with an additional student beginning in January 2021. The fields of study include Health Sciences, Clinical Medical Sciences, Pharmacy, Education, Teaching & Apparel Design. We strive to keep 8 to 9 students enrolled in college at all times.

This effort requires that \$10,000 be raised each year. We provide the initial \$5,000 in seed money and seek contributions from the congregation and friends of MVPC to reach the goal. You have supported this mission faithfully for 7 years and we ask that you do so again. This mission has, is, and will change the lives of the students, their families, and their communities.

This month we saw three of our families, two who are in the program (pictured above) and one who graduated a few months ago, but is still being supported by our alumni program. Those in the photo received the cars through the same program as Brian, who you will all remember from the times he stayed with us. The cars were donated by Charity Cars. Midas Alpharetta is the garage who did all the work to get the cars ready for our families.

The third family was doing quite well in their own apartment despite the mom having to undergo emergency surgery. After recovering from that and returning to work, her car failed and was unrepairable. Needless to say, the family needed a car to get to work, school activities and church. Our coordinator, Andrea shared with me that she was praying about the situation as she was at a loss as to how we would be able to help. The next morning Andrea received an email from one of our partner congregations to ask if Family Promise could accept a car donation, perhaps to sell for funding? The car was in rather good shape and the donor was overjoyed to have it given to the family in need.

Working with Family Promise as a volunteer is a mixture of emotions, the sadness we feel when we hear about families who are homeless, the satisfaction when we are able to provide a roof over their head and support to move on, and then the joy of finding that sometimes everything falls in to place to prevent a challenging situation from getting worse.

MVPC September 20, 2020, Session Meeting Summary

The Session continues to meet each month in ZOOM meetings. Rev. Abernethy opened the meeting with prayer; the clerk noted that all members were present. Rev. Abernethy welcomed visitors to the meeting who included the Confirmation Class, their parents, and confirmation coordinators and mentors.

Announcements/Reminders

1. Small groups (with the exception of the Towers group) will begin on September 27th and run for six weeks. Announcements about group opportunities are running in the weekly email, the church bulletin, and the Good News. All the groups will be using the PCUSA curriculum, "Facing Racism."

Offered by The Center for Lifelong Learning at Columbia Theological Seminary, an online program to address civic and political issues during the national election season will run from September 25-October 9, 2020. The program, "Talking Politics During Turbulent Times," is co-sponsored by Faith in Public Life, Georgia Interfaith Power and Light, Presbyterians for a Better Georgia, The Presbytery of Greater Atlanta and the Presbyterian Mission Agency Office of Public Witness of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. A single registration fee of \$30 provides access to the full range of resources offered as a part of this conference. The program is aimed at pastors and church leaders.

The Presbytery of Greater Atlanta is offering for a second time a virtual town hall on racism. The date is Saturday, October 3rd from 10:00-11:30. Information regarding participation comes through church pastors.

The devotional was given by Carrie Southard. External communications were received from the Atlanta Ministry with International Students (AMIS) thanking MVPC for a donation from our Outreach Ministry team; in addition, at the recent Presbytery of Greater Atlanta meeting, MVPC was recognized for our contribution from the COVID-19 fund to the New Church Development Commission which supports the needs of refugees and recent immigrants in the Atlanta area.

Rev. Abernethy led the Session in affirming our faith as stated in A Brief Statement of Faith. Following the affirmation of faith, Rev. Abernethy and Mr. Toney-Schmitt prepared the Session for examination of this year's Confirmands who include Sage Allen, Anna Barber, Sam Nelson, and Nathan Peji. Each Confirmand discussed the most meaningful experience in the confirmation process and then gave their statements of faith. Session members asked questions, made comments, and congratulated the group on the work they have done during the confirmation classes. Martha Baitcher and Beppie Lever coordinated the confirmation classes; confirmation mentors were Bruce Hagenau, Gloria Gillespie, Meg Christian, and David Barclift. The Session voted unanimously to recommend the Confirmands for membership in MVPC.

Ministry teams submitted written reports summarizing their work for the month. The Finance/Administration team noted that we are right on schedule with giving at this point in the church year. The team will work with Rev. Abernethy to plan a stewardship campaign this fall. The Outreach team announced the COVID-19 fund has received about \$55,000 and has disbursed most of these funds. The team is urging that we continue to give to the fund since the needs are great in the Sandy Springs and greater Atlanta communities because of job losses during the pandemic.

Old Business

The Session continues to address use of the church campus during the pandemic. The Worship Committee has worked hard to find ways the congregation can resume on-campus worship and presented two proposals for Session consideration. The first proposal allows for use of the sanctuary for prayer. Members who want to do this will be able to schedule prayer time as an individual or family unit following safeguards outlined in the proposal. Scheduling will be done through the church office. The Session approved this proposal.

The second proposal from the Worship Ministry team creates an outdoor worship service on four Sundays (two in October and two in November). The services will be in the courtyard area between the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall and will be limited to 75 seated participants who have made reservations to attend along with a few cars parked in some spaces beside the courtyard. Safety measures must be followed by participants. Online services will still be available for those who don't attend the outdoor services. Services will be at 11:00 am. The Session approved this proposal.

MVPC Commissioners (David Barclift, David Hill, MacKenzie Truitt) who attended the September 15th Presbytery Meeting reported to Session the business conducted at the meeting.

Session approved one additional Commissioner for the November 10th Presbytery Meeting. Commissioners for this meeting will be Dale Morine, Joy Carden, and Wit Truitt. Presbytery meetings will continue to be conducted as ZOOM meetings for the foreseeable future.

Session approved the transfer of membership of T.J. and Maggie Shirley to Sardis Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, NC.

Pastors' Report Rev. Abernethy and Mr. Toney-Schmitt

Rev. Abernethy reported that a broken pipe in the church office is being repaired. Currently there is a little inconvenience and noise from the equipment used to dry out the carpet. Rev. Abernethy has started classes in his doctoral program. The Abernethy's (Rev. Abernethy's parents) have moved from Texas and are settling into their home in the North Springs area. Rev. Abernethy will be visiting with and carrying food to Corny, the last living founding member of MVPC.

Mr. Toney-Schmitt is now onboard and has met with several ministry teams that he will work with. He has had an opportunity to meet with some of the youth and is excited about the work he will be doing here at MVPC.

Rev. Abernethy closed the meeting with prayer.
