Mark 9:14-29

14 When they came to the disciples, they saw a great crowd around them, and some scribes arguing with them. 15 When the whole crowd saw him, they were immediately overcome with awe, and they ran forward to greet him. 16 He asked them, "What are you arguing about with them?" 17 Someone from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought you my son; he has a spirit that makes him unable to speak; 18 and whenever it seizes him, it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, but they could not do so." 19 He answered them, "You faithless generation, how much longer must I be among you? How much longer must I put up with you? Bring him to me." 20 And they brought the boy to him. When the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. 21 Jesus asked the father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. 22 It has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you are able to do anything, have pity on us and help us."

23 Jesus said to him, "If you are able!—All things can be done for the one who believes." 24 Immediately the father of the child cried out, "I believe; help my unbelief!" 25 When Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You spirit that keeps this boy from speaking and hearing, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again!" 26 After crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, "He is dead." 27 But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he was able to stand. 28 When he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" 29 He said to them, "This kind can come out only through prayer."

Good morning! Grace, mercy, and peace in the name of Jesus Christ our Risen Lord. Welcome to Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church. We are delighted that you have chosen to worship with us this day. Please take a moment if you are watching on our website to fill out our virtual friendship pad below so we can know who you are, especially if you are a first time or recurring visitor and would like to know more about us.

Today, as you can see we are worshipping online, but next Sunday, November 15th, weather permitting, we will once again worship on the church lawn, and friends it will be a full day.

First, it will be Stewardship Sunday, so if you are planning to worship with us in-person, please go to our website to sign-up. We are welcoming up to 125 people to worship. Weather permitting, we will hold our monthly Taize service via livestream, but we will also allow up to 15 people to join us in person. This service will take place by the fireplace at Gailey Hall. Please sign-up on our website and bring you lawn chairs for this short 30 minute service of song, scripture, and stillness.

Finally, let us be in prayer for this country and for its political and civic leaders, for those who are still suffering from the pandemic.
