Joy and Sorrow

The Advent season has always been marked differently between the church and culture. It's why my friends and I have always hemmed and hawed when someone says there is a "war on Christmas!" Because of anything, cultural Christmas starts on black Friday, and for many of you, or at least the guy in our neighborhood whose front yard compares favorably to the Griswold's, Christmas has already begun. No, you ask plenty of pastor types, and we'll tell you the war is on Advent. For Advent is actually a solemn time. More "Watchman, tell us of the Night" and less Mariah Carey. A time of preparation, a time when the light is dim (hence why we light the Advent candle). Theologically, Advent asks us to contemplate a frightening reality, that we wonder what the world would be like without Christ. That's why the first Sunday often focuses on the Parable of the Ten Bridesmaids in Matthew 25 which ambiguously states "we do not know the day or the hour" of when Christ will come.

Back in July, I wrote a sermon titled An Advent State of Mind because so much of this year has been about preparation/anticipation. We stocked up on the essentials in preparation for hunkering down. We have waited anxiously for a vaccine to arrive.

We have tried to be cautious and loving toward one another, not knowing the day or the hour when life might return to "normal." In some respects, this year has been one long Advent Season. That's why we are augmenting some of what we usually do this time of year – in hopes you will find more joy while also giving you the opportunity to acknowledge the sorrow that has consumed this year.

This Advent we will sing the songs within the scripture. Each Sunday we will focus on the songs of Mary (Nov. 29), Zechariah (Dec. 6), the Angels (Dec. 13), and Simeon (Dec. 20), that will hopefully allow us to celebrate what has been missing from so much of our worship experience: the gift of song. Through that, we will lean into the Christmas season more than I have ever before as a pastor. We need what is comforting and nostalgic this year. We need to remember what is hopeful.

On the other end of this spectrum, we must not ignore what has been and continues to be. That's why on December 21st, the longest night of the year, we will offer a "Longest Night Service." This is a service that recognizes the loss, the grief, and the lament that we have shared collectively and as individuals. To help us find Christ even in the depths of darkness, Christina Toney-Schmitt, the spouse of Rev. Isaac Toney-Schmitt, will help us lead and facilitate this service. Christina currently works with breast cancer survivors and specializes in ministry dealing with grief. We are still in the planning stages of this service, but once we have firm details, we will be sharing that with you all.

Peace to you amid these short days and long nights. May the light within all of us shine bright, for so many are in need of a hopeful glimpse.

Covid-19 Fund

Reaching Out to Help Children

We are all aware of the adverse effects the pandemic has had on children. This is especially true of children living in households experiencing food and housing insecurity, those who live in homeless shelters, and unfortunately, those who sometimes live in their family car.

Thanks to the generosity of the congregation, the Covid Fund has provided funding to several of our partner ministries who in turn provide much needed assistance to these vulnerable children and their parents. These ministries include the Community Assistance Center, Family Promise, Stirred Up Ministries, the Alliance for Children Everywhere/Zambia, the Drake House, Los Niños Primero, Garden Presbyterian Church and School/Zambia, and our Presbytery's New Church Development Commission (refugee and immigrant congregations).

Another outstanding ministry that Mount Vernon has supported for many years, including a donation from the Covid Fund, is the International Women's House, a shelter for abused immigrant and refugee women and their children. In addition to financial support, the shelter has been the recipient of numerous communion offerings and the annual toy drive for their Santa shop. Just this week, Anna Blau, IWH's executive director, wrote "I did not want to miss the opportunity to let you know how special Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church is to us". 



MVPC November 15, 2020, Session Meeting Summary

The Session held its monthly meeting via ZOOM on November 15th. Rev. Abernethy opened the meeting with prayer and the clerk noted that 14 of the 16 Session members were present. There were no visitors at the meeting.

Announcements/Reminders:

The Presbytery of Greater Atlanta is holding a town hall meeting Saturday, November 21, 10:00–11:30 am, entitled, A House United: How the Church Can Save the World. The author of the book by the same title, Allen Hilton, will lead the town hall that will focus on bridging the divisions in such a divisive political atmosphere. People interested in participating can contact Session Clerk, David Hill, who can provide you with information about this ZOOM meeting.

Ministry Team Reports

Each Ministry Team presented its monthly report. The Congregational Care Team reported that Stephen Ministers will begin making contact with elderly shut-ins as a way of helping them connect with the church. Since the pandemic has limited the caseloads of Stephen Ministers, this will be a good way to use their expertise in serving older members of the congregation who are more isolated by the pandemic.

The Finance/Administration team reported that pledges continue to come in and we remain close to where we need to be with the budget. Members are encouraged to continue their pledge giving, but also give to the COVID-19 fund since so many people have been adversely impacted by the pandemic. The Session appreciates members who have created the short stewardship videos that spotlight their commitment to stewardship at MVPC.

The Outreach Ministry Team reported that the COVID-19 Task Force continues to disperse funds to various organizations in support of their work during the pandemic. The fund right now is down to only a few hundred dollars so continued giving is important. At this point, about \$57,000 has been dispersed to various area ministries and to our work in Zambia.

Family Promise families continue to be housed at St. Luke's during the pandemic. The earliest we will see Family Promise back on the MVPC campus will be July 2021.

The Worship Ministry Team announced the outdoor worship service schedule for the remainder of the year includes outdoor services on December 6th and 20th and a 4:30 pm Christmas Eve candlelight service limited to 125 people. Members will have the opportunity to sign-up for the Christmas Eve service first before it is opened-up to others. If the demand is great, there is the possibility of adding a second Christmas Eve outdoor service. Because January is such a cold month, outdoor service will not resume until January 24th.

The Youth Ministry Team reported that high school youth continue to meet outdoors on Sunday afternoons. They are in the process of creating hygiene kits that will be distributed to nearby homeless shelters.

Old and New Business

During the pandemic the Session continues to list use of the church campus as an item of business each month.

The Session discussed whether meeting regulations related to Gailey Hall can be expanded beyond what is presently allowed. After discussion, members felt that there should be no changes at this time since safety in the pandemic continues to dictate limited use of indoor spaces.

Three new business items were addressed. First, MVPC Commissioners to the November 10 Presbytery Meeting gave a summary of that meeting. No action by the Session was needed. Second, the Session determined the annual Christmas Eve offering this year should be designated for the COVID-19 fund. Third, the baptism of Jacqueline Penelope Nix was approved and will be part of the December 6th service with December 20th as a back-up date.

Pastors' Report

Rev. Toney-Schmitt reported that he continues to enjoy getting to know members and work with the youth. He looks forward to postpandemic times when his work can be done in a more normal environment.

Rev. Abernethy reports having worked with the Administration and Finance Ministry Team to develop an In-Reach Fund policy. The In-Reach Fund is a small part of the budget that can be used to assist members with financial problems. In normal years the fund is rarely used but with the pandemic more people are needing assistance. Before, there have been no written guidelines to provide structure to the fund and processes for making decisions about disbursement of funds. The Ministry Team approved the guidelines that will assure a fair and equitable process for use of the fund. Rev. Abernethy also reported that staff evaluations have been completed. He indicated staff feel very supported by Session and the congregation.

With all business completed, Carrie Southard offered the closing prayer, and the meeting was adjourned by Rev. Abernethy.

Our next week of support for Family Promise is 12/20/2020 through 12/27/2020. Be on the lookout for the Signup Genius. We will be providing support for the families in the program and one overnight volunteer each night as they stay in place at St. Luke's Presbyterian Church.

An additional signup will be sent to all congregations in North Fulton /Dekalb to give all of our volunteers a chance to provide a Christmas Gift for those in the program, should they wish. This is to ensure that all families have a chance to receive something approved by their parents.

We have three families in the program. One family is almost ready to graduate and another is waiting to take their place. The two other families have recently joined us. A single dad with an 8-year -old son and a Mom and Dad with three young children, 8, 6, and 5 months. We know that with the support from the Family Promise staff and our congregations they will benefit from our program.

Family Promise Update

Thank you all so much for continuing to work so hard for us from afar. The supplies, gift cards, and cleaning fees are crucial to our families and to our affiliate! Because of YOU, we have not skipped a beat!!!!

We have been able to broaden the scope of services so we can assist families experiencing homelessness, outside our affiliate. We are able to provide blessing bags, gift cards, hotel stays, supplies, snacks, water, and more.

Family Promise North Fulton/DeKalb received \$50,000 from the City of Dunwoody! Along with 7 other Dunwoody organizations, we received these funds through the Cares Act and the City of Dunwoody to serve our community and the most vulnerable population that has been impacted by Covid-19. We are so grateful for these funds that will help us continue to expand our scope of services.

Kayla and Isiah graduate! Kayla and Isiah transitioned to their own apartment on the third weekend in October and are doing well.

FPNFD gets started on Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) this is a program where providers like us share information and coordinate services. This system will also assist Wanda with quality data entry such as case notes, compliance, and accurate reporting. HMIS also complements our grant writing efforts because we can track our families and their outcomes. The best part is that Family Promise National received a Federal Grant which will support the cost!

Sam Klein joins the Family Promise Board of Directors! Although Temple Beth Tikvah is taking a break from the rotation in 2021, Sam will be serving on our Board of Directors.

Gradual Rotation Start-Up in 2021 Thanks to our Advisory Committee we plan to leave St. Luke's a static site in January. We are working with 3 congregations to house our families for a month at a time beginning in January 2021. This will be the first phase to a gradual process of re-opening and since all the congregations have different amenities each will have different procedures all with limited volunteer contact. As a congregation, we will still ask for your help with food and/or gift cards, supplies, and overnight volunteers. These three congregations will ONLY be housing our families unless it is their week on the host schedule.
