



MVPC December 20, 2020, Session Meeting Summary

The Session held its monthly meeting via ZOOM on December 20th. Rev. Abernethy opened the meeting with prayer. Fifteen of the sixteen Session members were present. There were no visitors at the meeting.

Announcements/Reminders:

The annual Session Retreat will be a ZOOM meeting on Saturday, January 23rd from 8:00 am until noon.

New Elders (Ben Barber, Angie Hawthorne, and Amy Kiley) will be ordained in the January 24th worship service.

The Presbytery of Greater Atlanta has posted on their YouTube channel the recent townhall meeting, "A House United" led by Allen Hilton. This is a wonderful townhall based on Hilton's book by the same title. The author contends the church at large has contributed greatly to the divide in our country, but the church can and must lead in reuniting the country. Access the townhall by going to the Presbytery website – <u>https://www.atlpcusa.org/</u> – and on the right side of the home page clicking on the little YouTube symbol. Once you get to YouTube, click on "Subscribe" since this helps increase the visibility of our Presbytery in the YouTube world. Then look for the townhall video featuring Allen Hilton.

External Communications:

Rev. Lindsey Armstrong, Executive Director of our Presbytery's New Church Development Commission (NCDC) sent an email to MVPC thanking us for our support of NCDC's emergency fund through our COVID-19 Fund. The money MVPC sent was used to purchase food for immigrant and refugee families impacted by the pandemic.

Ministry Team Reports

Each Ministry Team presented its monthly report. The **Christian Education** Team reported that 15 homebound members received Christmas cards made by the children of the church. Carrie Southard thanked Donna Neumann for providing the materials to make the cards and Joy Carden who helped identify who would receive the cards. Small group surveys have been collected and will be tabulated to provide the Christian Education team data regarding how we can continue to provide meaningful small group learning opportunities. **Congregational Care** has been able to extend its outreach to shut ins with help from Stephen Ministers. This has worked very well in providing additional contact with older members.

The **Finance and Administration** Ministry Team approved yearend bonuses for church staff who have worked under difficult circumstances during this pandemic year. November giving was slightly lower than expected, but December is almost always a month when giving increases so the ministry team believes we will reach our budgeted giving for the year. Because of the pandemic, church expenses are down so this also will help MVPC complete the year within budget. Even though the stewardship campaign has ended, the church has not received pledge cards from many people who normally give. The committee will begin making contacts to be certain all have had a chance to pledge for 2021. A big thanks goes out to John Chestnutt and David Barclift who are responsible for the new cross that was constructed and placed on the Sanctuary Building exterior overlooking the courtyard where our outdoor services are held. Staff recently installed the new cross.

The **Outreach** Ministry Team reported that the COVID-19 fund continues to receive and disburse funds. A significant contribution has been received in the last few days. Yearend giving should also

provide additional funds for the identified ministries supported by the fund. To date the fund has received more than \$60,000. John Hibbard, reporting for the Witness Ministry Team, presented a detailed report of attendance comparing 2019 and 2020 church attendance. Attendance for 2020 has been good using an online format and later in the fall a combination of online and outdoor services. He explained the challenge of counting online attendance. To be as accurate as possible online participants were counted as 1.5 persons at each computer since available data counts computers, not people. Analyzing this data on an ongoing basis will help us examine and consider possible ways we can reach those who may never come to an on-campus worship service. The **Youth** Ministry Team reported that the Youth program has had a successful fall with the arrival of Associate Pastor, Isaac Toney-Schmitt. Attendance on Sunday evenings has seen a high of 13 with 10 regular attendees. The youth put together hygiene kits that have been delivered for homeless people at Atlanta Mission.

Old and New Business

During the pandemic, the Session continues to list use of the church campus as an item of business each month. The baptism of Jacqueline Penelope Nix needs to be rescheduled because of family illness so the Session approved her baptism for a future worship service.

Calendars for the 2021 church year were approved including the dates for:

Stated Session meetings – Session will meet the third Sunday of each month except for January when the Session meeting becomes part of the Session Retreat; there is no Session meeting scheduled for June.

Communion – Communion is scheduled for the first Sunday of each month. In addition, communion will be celebrated on other special occasions. Once First Cup is able to resume oncampus worship services communion is approved for those services.

Communion Offerings and Special Offerings – various outreach partners were designated for offerings throughout the year including the special Presbyterian offerings.

Pastors' Reports

Both pastors indicated they are working on innovative ways to create meaningful worship experiences during online and outdoor worship services. Worship services for most of January will be online; the next outdoor service is scheduled for January 24th. Some of the events coming up in the near future include the burning of the palms in February, Ash Wednesday, and a possible Easter vigil the night before Easter. One upcoming service will address how we might think about our faith statements in six words. Sounds interesting!

With all business completed, Rev. Abernethy offered the closing prayer and then adjourned the meeting.



Six-Word Story of Faith

I spent so much of this past year thinking, discussing, and preaching about what we lost. 2020 will be a forever lament. Yet as we turn to 2021, I want to ponder what we gained. Because as a church we did gain, or rather were forced to out of necessity. Pastors and theologians have been saying for some time now that with all the technology at our fingertips we need to engage our congregants as more than people in the pews but rather as conversation partners. They point to parts of worship, like the sermon, that are more like a lecture rather than a conversation. So in that spirit I want to invite you – well, it's January so let's call it a resolution- to share with me (either openly or anonymously) your *Six-Word Story of Faith*.

That's right, I want you to think/pray/ponder and then write out the six words that most fully represent your faith. For instance, my six words would be:

Forged by family, compelled by community.



These six words succinctly tell the story of how my faith is rooted in the family that made church a priority and opened me to the story of Christ, and how that example has continued on past childhood through a communion of saints that have served, supported, nurtured, and loved me and in turn motivated me to share this vision with others through the vocation of pastor. Below is a space with six lines for you to consider your six-word story. I hope you will take time to do it, or if more than one person is in your household, might you offer them a piece of paper to complete this exercise and when done, either send it by snail mail to the church or drop it in the collection box at one of our outdoor worship services. Or if that is too "old school" for you, simply email the church and share with us your six words. These "stories" will be utilized throughout the Lenten Season, which begins on February 17th. As you share, you open us to your story of faith and we in turn share ours with you. Blessings to you, and I look forward to this conversation with you.




