Covid-19 Update

First off, we want to let you know that our Worship Committee, who has led our Covid-19 response, in consultation with Isaac and myself, have concluded that due to the winter weather and the viral surge we are seeing locally that we will halt our outdoor, in-person services through February. As of right now, we hope to return to in-person gatherings in March. As always, we will keep you notified of decisions we make, and we will continue to prioritize your safety above all.

Future Worship Highlights

Going forward, we have a lot going on. Next week, we will ordain and install our new elder class- since we planned to do this service in person, we will send out more details about this service this coming week. Stewardship/Mission/MVP Foundation Update

I would also be remiss if I did not share how grateful we are for your benevolence this past year. Because of you I can report that the Finance and Administration Team were overwhelmed by your generosity in 2020 and because of you we had a tremendously healthy year. Concurrently, you have also given \$65,000 to our Covid-19 fund, of which more than \$60,000 has already been dispersed to mission partners both locally and globally. Finally, I want to offer a note of thanks for the Mount Vernon Foundation. Since its inception, the Foundation, of which many of you have been faithful patrons, has given more than \$400,000. This past fall, the Foundation once again came through when it helped us secure needed funds to fulfill plans for the new cross that hangs over the courtyard on our campus.
