#### **Covid Fund Update**

Through the Covid Fund, Mount Vernon has provided financial assistance to the New Church Development Commission (NCDC) of the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta who in turn assists congregations composed mostly of refugees and immigrants greatly affected by the pandemic. Below is a letter (slightly edited for brevity) from Rev. Dr. Lindsay Armstrong, President/CEO of the NCDC:

Dear MVPC Covid Task Force and the many generous supporters of this Fund and Church,

I am honored and humbled to receive your latest contribution of \$2,500 to your Atlanta-area friends and neighbors in new worshipping communities who are suffering economic hardship during the pandemic. Truly this season has stretched and challenged us all, taking much but also bringing us <u>closer</u> in unexpected ways.

In fact, you are now <u>closer</u> to:

A family who took in additional family members whose jobs disappeared early in the pandemic. A 1600 square foot, 3-bedroom house now is home to 11 people. Financial assistance from MVPC paid their utility bill and provided food from Kroger gift cards. Because of you, 11 people including 5 children are staying warm, fed, and out of homeless shelters.

Three refugee families forced from their homes and relocated to Clarkston, GA. Their sole sources of income are minimum wage jobs at a poultry processing plant. After 3 months of eating almost nothing but rice, your donations covered the cost of bags of rice and Kroger gift cards which provided them food, medicine, a thermometer, bathroom tissue, and peace of mind.

You also provided a lifeline to another family their pastors knew about – a family that looks and acts fine but cannot pay bills because of a layoff and unexpected financial turn. Your Kroger gift cards, and their ingenuity kept food on the table, fear at bay, and knowledge that they are not alone. Because of you they made it and one parent recently regained employment. Your gifts saw them through and are seeing many others through as well.

Mount Vernon, thank you. You're not only providing life altering, emergency assistance. You are also providing your outreach, care, love, and support for new Presbyterians and people who could so easily be feeling overlooked, helpless, hopeless, and unloved. Because of you, they know love, care and needs met.

It is an honor to steward so much of your generosity. We will continue to be about this work until emergency need related to this pandemic are more fully subsiding. I am giving. You are giving. We are all in this together, and it is making a difference.

### Summary of the Stated Meeting of the Session Sunday, February 21, 2021

Rev. Abernethy called the meeting to order and opened with prayer at 1:00 pm. The Session continues to meet using Zoom video conferencing. All but one elder was present along with both pastors.

#### **Announcements/Reminders:**

The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held immediately following the outdoor worship service on March 21<sup>st</sup>. The 2020 Annual Report will be presented; the congregation will be asked to approve Rev. Abernethy's revised terms of call; and the congregation will elect the Nominating Committee, MVPC Foundation Officers, and officers for the Corporation.

We received a letter from Rev. Lindsay Armstrong from the Presbytery's New Church Development Commission (NCDC) thanking MVPC for our recent \$2,500 contribution from our COVID-19 Fund. This contribution will help support families who have lost their housing because of job losses during the pandemic. MVPC has made previous contributions to NCDC that go into helping metro Atlanta families. The letter gives a lot of detail regarding specifics of our support. God is working through our congregation to touch the lives of so many less fortunate people! Thanks to Carol Beckman and the COVID Task Force for their work in coordinating with NCDC and other partner organizations!

Various ministry teams gave reports including Christian Education which reported that a new children's curriculum, *Godly Play*, will be used during the outdoor worship services.

Children will gather on the patio and will be led by Braegan Abernethy during a portion of the worship service. Braegan will go through training; Mount Vernon School will allow MVPC to use the program materials so no purchase will be necessary. In addition, the weekly phone devotional has been extended by 10 minutes to allow unstructured talk time so participants can talk informally. The response has been very positive. As previously announced, small group studies will begin after Easter on April 11<sup>th</sup> and run five to six weeks. Multiple study offerings will be available and will be announced in March. The group that normally meets at Mount Vernon Towers has been approved to meet indoors there as long as participants have been fully vaccinated and follow pandemic safety measures.

The Congregational Care ministry team reported that Stephen Ministers continue to reach out to isolated shut-ins to provide support and maintain a regular line of communication to meet their needs.

David Barclift reported that the drive-in Ash Wednesday pancake dinner went well and thanked those who helped. Providing the dinner in to-go boxes was a good way to safely provide the meals. Those who participated enjoyed the meal and the short service our pastoral team provided in the parking lot. The Fellowship team hopes we will be able to schedule additional fellowship opportunities while following safety guidelines.

The Finance/Administration ministry team announced that January giving was good and is on target to meet budget needs. The team discussed improved signage at parking lot entrances but will want to coordinate with the upcoming road construction around the church. The team did discover an error in the proposed 2021 budget that was approved at the January Session meeting. The corrected budget was reviewed and then approved by the Session.

Going forward, financial processes and timelines are being reviewed by the ministry team and staff and will be in place when next year's budget is developed. The new processes will create a longer timeline for budget development as well as greater input from ministry teams.

The Outreach ministry team reported that Family Promise families are moving from St. Luke's to Roswell Baptist and will be housed there for a while. MVPC will be responsible for providing food and other items as well as overnight hosts for the second week of March. People need to use Sign-up Genius to volunteer support for Family Promise. The Ash Wednesday dry goods donations were overwhelming. These donations will go to the Community Assistance Center. The third Sunday of each month has been designated for sandwich-making and delivery of sandwiches to the Clifton shelter – volunteer sandwich makers are needed! The team reported that donations to the COVID-19 Fund are down right now, but more money is needed because the needs of families remain great during the pandemic.

The Witness Ministry Team designed and purchased banners to display at the two main church parking lot entrances. The banners advertise to the community the opportunity to worship at MVPC online. The team will focus this year on a variety of ways of getting the community involved in our church.

The Worship ministry team has added a once-a-month fellowship opportunity using Zoom technology following the church service. Details will be announced. The team is also working on a worship plan for Good Friday with plans to be announced soon. We begin outdoor worship services in March with three outdoor services (March 7 and 21 and then on Palm Sunday, March 28). The pattern of outdoor services on the first and third Sundays will continue in April and beyond with online services on other Sundays.

Jon Barber and Rev. Toney-Schmitt pointed out the excellent job the youth did in leading the Youth Sunday worship service.

Rev. Abernethy noted the church staff continues to do an excellent job under the trying circumstances of the pandemic. A quarantine leave policy for staff recently has been developed. While most staff are able to work from home, the policy makes accommodation for those who may not be able to do so.

Rev. Abernethy closed the meeting with prayer. Stated Session meetings are scheduled for the third Sunday of each month (there is no June meeting). The next meeting will be March 21<sup>st</sup>.

Reconnected with cousins and life-long friends.

Checked on neighbors who live alone.

Filled and expanded our minds with good books and good movies.

Limited our t.v. viewing to once a day and limited social media.

Found some form of exercise to renew our strength and energy.

Helped with the church's Congregational Care needs during the pandemic.

Cooked, Sewed, and shared with others.

Helped friends and neighbors get vaccination information.

Took moments each day to experience and be reassured and renewed by nature whether from a window, a cul-de-sac stroll, a dog walk, or a visit to a park.

Praised God continually for his protection and care.
