

#### From 30,000 Feet to 471 Mount Vernon

Recently I came across the highlights of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) 2020 statistical report. Each year this is sent out, it is the 30,000 foot barometer for how the denomination is doing. This year was largely no different from every other year that I have been alive. The PCUSA lost 4.3% of its membership and currently the denomination has 1.24 million members. As a denomination, we have not experienced numerical growth since our membership peaked at 4.25 million people in 1965.

I think this is why I don't get too worried when I read this news each year. People have been telling me the church is dying since I was a kid, and each year later, we look back and come to the conclusion that the good things took place and good news was shared. If you were at our annual meeting in late March, I believe you once again sensed that truth as you departed our courtyard. Are the days where masses of people joined the church each year largely gone? Yes. On one of my first Sundays in the late summer of 2019 we had 7 people join one morning. Not counting confirmation classes, I suspect I will never see that again. Maybe, but I am not counting on it. We are in an era where growth will take place 1-2 people at a time. I don't expect us to gain young families with children just because their child starts attending the Mount Vernon School. Nor do I expect a visitor to join just because they came to worship with us 3-4 times and took one of our welcome bags home (Though I think I would join based on the bags alone! Who doesn't need a tasty jam in their life!). In this time of mistrust toward institutions, people demand a relationship to form before a commitment will take place. I welcome that. It means they will likely remain involved and active once they do formally join.

People of Mount Vernon you are a very self-motivated congregation. You amaze and inspire your staff and I with your resilience, determination, and belief that your church has so much to offer whoever walks onto the courtyard and hopefully, in the near future, into the sanctuary. That's why during the pandemic, your statistical report at 471 Mount Vernon did not match the 30,000 foot view of the PCUSA. Your membership stayed stable. Depending upon how you breakdown "views" of our online worship services, we might have actually seen a bump in attendance.

Recently, I saw where church pastors asked one another if they received a second Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan. We didn't. Why? Because we didn't qualify. Your giving, not just to our church, but beyond, to our Covid-19 fund, ensured that. That tells me you believe the work we are doing is necessary. It tells me you too do not put much stock in the narrative. It tells me that for all the sadness and angst that we see swirling around and that, yes, is within our communal body, we believe God will provide.

Keep sharing our story. Invite a friend, better yet, invite two. We have a good story to tell. One that people, I believe and I think you believe, long for. Let's share that story of 471 Mount Vernon. Otherwise, they will only see the 30,000 foot view.

## Summary of the Stated Meeting of the Session Sunday, April 18, 2021

Rev. Abernethy called the meeting to order and opened with prayer at 1:00 pm. The Session continues to meet using Zoom video conferencing. All elders were present along with both pastors.

#### **Announcements/Reminders:**

The Worship Ministry Team is planning three outdoor worship services for May the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Various ministry teams gave reports including Christian Education which announced that Small Groups are off to a good start. This spring we have five groups meeting, one of which is for young adults. Vacation Bible School will not be held; instead, children will have planned outings as well as opportunities to work on service projects. More information will be announced at a later date.

The Finance/Administration ministry team announced that member giving is still on track to address budget needs. The ministry team did point out that in the near future the church will need to replace the HVAC system in the sanctuary building. This system is well beyond its life expectancy. Replacement will be costly, but the expense will be shared between the church and Mount Vernon School.

The Outreach ministry team reminded the Session that the COVID Pandemic Fund, administered through the MVPC Foundation was created one year ago this month. We did not know how successful the effort to help our community during this unprecedented time would be, but as always, the MVPC family has come through with generous contributions. To date, about \$81,000 has been contributed and used to support the work of a variety of outreach partners. The need continues to be great so the COVID Task Force encourages everyone's continued generosity.

The Witness Ministry Team's hard work is paying off. The Easter Sunday outdoor worship service had eight visitors. More events are in the works to help the community know about our church community.

#### **Church Rolls Update**

New Members – In the Sunday service we welcomed Minnie Robinson, a longtime attendee as a new member. Minnie joins Mount Vernon through reaffirmation of faith.

#### **Old and New Business**

Several actions were taken by the Session related to use of the church campus. Over the past year the pandemic forced major changes and implementation of CDC guidelines to protect against COVID-19. As conditions improve, we are able to loosen some of the restrictions.

Beginning with the new school year in August, Mount Vernon School will be able to resume using those parts of the building that were unavailable to the school this year including use of the sanctuary for chapel and the choir room for performing arts.

The Atlanta Concert Band has been approved to use the church courtyard for rehearsals following safety protocols and at times the campus is not in use by church groups.

The Youth Ministry Team was approved to serve cupcakes following the outdoor worship service on May 2<sup>nd</sup>. This service is Senior Sunday when we recognize those who will be graduating from high schools and postsecondary schools.

Additional communion services were approved for May 16<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioners who will represent MVPC at the May 11<sup>th</sup> Presbytery meeting will be Mary Kilgore, Dale Morine, and David Hill.

Joy Carden gave the Session an update on the work of the Congregational Care Ministry Team. Ministry teams this year are updating the descriptions of their responsibilities. Part of the updating process is presenting to and seeking feedback from the Session. Each month a different ministry team will present.

#### **Pastor's Reports**

Rev. Abernethy reports that he has been in discussions with Columbia Seminary about the possibility of having a ministry intern working at our church in the near future. The pastoral staff and the Worship Ministry Team are looking ahead at how worship services might take place as pandemic conditions improve. At the worship service an informal poll was taken regarding the congregation's feelings about moving to indoor worship. The results: 39 people indicated a willingness to worship indoors, 6 said no to moving indoors, and 30 people did not respond.

Rev. Toney-Schmitt discussed the youth gatherings this spring and the various styles of worship they used. He is looking forward to and hoping the youth will be able to move indoors in the fall so they can add food and fellowship to the Sunday afternoon gatherings.

Rev. Toney-Schmitt closed the meeting with prayer.

The Session will continue to conduct business using Zoom video conferencing. The next meeting will be on May 16<sup>th</sup> and will begin at 1:00 pm.

## The COVID-19 Fund – A Year in Review



The COVID-19 Fund was established by Session at its April 2020 meeting, and members of the Task Force (Carol Beckman, Christy Hill, and Jeanne Mielke) were approved at the same time. The purpose of the fund was to give the congregation an opportunity to make donations to go directly to our ministry partners to help them more effectively deal with the added challenges of the Covid pandemic.

Through regular online meetings and close communication with our ministry partners, the Task Force has prayerfully considered how to disperse the funds so generously donated by the congregation. To date, \$80,882 has been received and \$77,471 dispersed to address hunger, homelessness, and quality of life issues in Sandy Springs, the greater Atlanta area, and across the world in Zambia. 
