



Passing Ordinary Time, by Enuma Okoro



The Session met Sunday, May 16th for its May Stated Session Meeting. Following is a summary of that meeting.

The Atlanta Ministry with International Students (AMIS) sent a letter of thanks to MVPC resulting from the \$1,000 recently donated from the MVPC Outreach Ministry budget. Last year AMIS served 300 international students at 15 Atlanta area colleges and universities from over 40 countries. Over 100 volunteers were involved in AMIS's Amigo Friendship Partners program. Many of this year's functions have been hosted outdoors because of the pandemic. AMIS thanks MVPC for our ongoing support of their ministries.

Ministry Team Work

The Christian Education Ministry Team is having discussions regarding what CE might "look like" when the new church year begins in September. Two questions are guiding the discussion: what have we learned during the pandemic that will expand CE and how will we offer programs for children when we have so few children.

Finance/Administration/Stewardship reports that giving remains strong. This summer new doors are being installed throughout the campus since many doors are difficult to operate and lock. The school will share a large part of the replacement cost.

Good News

The MVPC Foundation has an anonymous donor who will match donations up to \$21,000. The Foundation has just finished its giving season distributing \$42,000 to those organizations that submitted requests.

The Outreach Ministry Team is working with Family Promise in preparation for the two-week July period when MVPC will host the families on our campus. Safety for the families and hosts is a primary concern so details are being worked out.

The COVID Fund is still in need of donations. People who are living on the edge have been most impacted by the pandemic. Recovery will be a slow process for these people so the fund will continue to play an important role for them.

The Witness Ministry Team is distributing visitor bags to first time visitors. Upcoming events include Blessing of the Animals combined with a food drive. These events will be advertised through the Next-Door app and signs around campus entrances. The ministry team is working on the idea of creating a Love Your Neighbor Day.

The Worship Ministry Team has made revisions to procedures for funerals and for worship service ushers.

Session Business

Session voted to return to indoor worship and indoor Sunday School beginning May 23rd. The Worship Ministry Team and staff have worked out details regarding pandemic safety measures that comply with guidelines issues by the CDC. Specific details will be announced. A fellowship luncheon was approved to follow the church service on June 6th. Since the weather is warming up Session members agreed it will be best to have the lunch indoors in Fellowship Hall as well as provide outdoor seating on the patio next to Fellowship Hall.

A letter to the Sandy Springs City Council in support of the proposed Holocaust Museum as proposed by the Georgia Holocaust Commission was approved by Session.

Communion will be served at the June 20th service when we welcome the Los Niños Primero children and their parents.

MVPC Commissioners who attended the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta meeting reported approval by the Presbytery to readmit Rev. Rick Sommers to the Presbytery. Rick is a former MVPC pastor.

MVPC will host a Columbia Seminary intern who will be with us beginning in September. Shari Freeman will work with church staff in various capacities throughout the first and second semesters.

The Session will not meet in June. The next Stated Session meeting will be July 18th.

Fides Quaerens Intellectum or Are You Reading This?

The first half of this title refers to the Latin phrase *Faith Seeking Understanding* which was a favorite theological view of early Christian scholars like Augustine. What it means is that we are called to constantly question and refine our belief. As Presbyterians, or Reformed Christians, we believe this process of questioning, discerning, praying, and refining is core to living out our faith.

Which gets me to the second part of the title. Not long ago I told a church member that in some ways I feel like we are living out the plot of *Apollo 13*. You remember how the astronauts had to shut down their spaceship in order to survive the trip but that upon reentry they start everything back up. With each press of the button, they wondered what would happen. That's where your staff and I am. We are pressing buttons. Wondering what will happen when the light comes back on.

That's why I am asking if you are reading this. Pastors like me spent our pandemic becoming content creators. We created this content because after we shut everything down and told you to stay home, we believed content would keep the church alive and you engaged. You saw this in the form of online Sunday worship, Wednesday Taizé services, and (almost) daily Mount Vernon Moments. Now as we reenter the world, we are asking what do we need, what do we want, and, most importantly, what helps us celebrate the gospel of Jesus Christ.

So, for starters, I have been asking do we need this newsletter? And if we do, should we keep it in its current mold. We already have Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, a weekly email, and Sunday announcements, and we are asking do we really need all this or do we need to be using it differently to communicate effectively and efficiently.

Beyond this though, we are asking more fundamental questions around the worship of God. Should we continue with two services? Should we have a permanent outdoor service? Should we move a service back into the Fellowship Hall? Mind you, these are not my thoughts. These are thoughts you have shared with me. This summer we will have two townhall style sessions immediately following Sunday worship on June 27th and July 25th for you to offer input on the future of our worshipping life.

All of these questions surround identity. Who are we and how do we want to exercise our faith? I believe this is no different from many if not all churches right now. Our location in suburban Atlanta with its changing identity is calling us to respond to these important questions and to begin the process of living into our new normal, whatever that may be. And that process begins with a simple question: Are you reading this?

COVID 19 Fund Update Looking Ahead

We rejoice in signs that life is slowly returning to "normal" as warmer weather approaches and more people are vaccinated. Unfortunately for our ministry partners, many will continue to face challenges for months and possibly years



ahead. Reductions in individual donations and the inability to do large group fundraisers during the pandemic along with a tremendous increase in requests for assistance have all contributed to a financial crisis for some of our longtime partners.

The COVID 19 Fund Task Force has identified several outstanding ministries that continue to need our financial support. These include:

Family Promise of North Fulton/DeKalb – In addition to providing shelter and support for 3 – 4 homeless families, the program also provides emergency assistance to additional families (some currently living in their cars) while they wait for space in a shelter. This assistance includes gasoline cards, grocery cards, sometimes an overnight stay in a hotel to give the family a chance to shower and get a good night's sleep, and assistance by a social worker to help them find long-term solutions. Stirred-Up Ministries – After more than a year of virtual tutoring and other enrichment programs, Stirred-Up Ministries has plans to again operate its summer camp program for at-risk youth in the East Lake area of downtown Atlanta. Strict procedures will be followed to insure the health and safety of all volunteers and participants. Funding is needed for gasoline to operate the bus, tutoring supplies, meals/snacks, and other necessities.

Alliance for Children Everywhere and Garden Presbyterian Church in Zambia – Zambia continues to struggle with challenges from the pandemic. Donations from the COVID Fund can assist in providing food to vulnerable children at the House of Moses and Bill and Betty Bryant Home as well as elderly members of Garden Presbyterian Church.

The New Church Development Commission (Presbytery of Greater Atlanta) – Additional funding will provide food and other assistance to members of new worshipping communities who continue to struggle with the aftereffects of the pandemic.

We ask for your continued prayers for these organizations and the people they serve.
