



COVID FUND FINAL REPORT

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Matthew 25

Since the Covid Fund was established by Session in April 2020, the congregation has responded generously: \$90,074 has been donated! These funds enabled our ministry partners to help meet the overwhelming challenges caused by the pandemic. \$88,171 was dispersed by mid August. Final allocations will be made by September 1.

More than 50% of the donations were allocated to address food scarcity in the greater Atlanta area and across the world in Zambia with the remaining funds used for basic human needs such as medical supplies, emergency assistance to homeless families, school supplies to allow at-risk students to learn virtually, and other necessities of life.









Covid Fund Recipient Display at Fellowship Luncheon, August 1





What makes a Stephen Ministry relationship work? And how are the relationships different?

People who have been in a Stephen Ministry relationship consistently say these (para-phrased) things about it:

- * My Stephen Minister never made comparisons to her life. The focus was totally on me and my life. Being able to put my feelings into words and to be heard and understood meant everything. Hearing myself say what I was feeling, helped unburden me and freed me to begin working on the future.
- * I felt my Stephen Minister was a constant in my life when so much else was in confusion. Having that steady, loving, helpful presence in my life gave me the courage I needed to move ahead.
- * After listening intently to me, my Stephen Minister made statements and asked me questions that helped me clarify and redirect my thinking. She did not advise but helped me become clearer on issues that would help me grow.
- *My Stephen Minister helped by sharing scripture and biblical stories much like my own dilemma. He prayed with and for me.
- *I was having deep feelings over a health issue. I knew my family was fearful and didn't want to share my fears with them. My Stephen Minister listened to all my worries and fears, not downplaying my anxiety, and encouraged and comforted me.
- * I learned new resources and options to help me change the direction of my life that I had not known about. My Stephen Minister presented them as possible ideas and new paths to explore.

Summary of Session Meeting August 15

Ministry Team Reports:

Christian Education reminded the Session that Small Groups will be organizing soon. The start date for Small Groups is September 26. Groups will run for five to six weeks. Opportunities to sign-up will begin on September 5.

Fellowship reminded Session we will have a church barbeque on September 19 as we welcome our new intern, Shari Freeman. Ms. Freeman comes to us from Columbia Seminary and will spend the academic year at MVPC.

The Finance Team reported that offering collections for the month remain on track for what they should be at this point in the year. There was a discussion regarding the fact that so many people give electronically, offering plates are pretty empty. This could be a poor example for children and visitors. More discussion will follow as we seek solutions to this issue.

Under **Old Business**, ministry teams continued presentations regarding the duties and functions of their teams. Session members posed questions and offered suggestions as a way for the teams to improve their work. This month we heard from Finance, Fellowship, and Senior Adult. Next month we will complete presentations as we hear from Youth, Personnel, and Worship.

Under **New Business**, the Session reviewed a proposed structure for Sunday mornings based on information gathered over several months. Discussion included the pros and cons to the proposed structure. Previous communications have outlined the Sunday morning schedule to be:

Conversations (Sunday School or Bible Study) from 9:30 to 10:15 Connections (Fellowship) from 10:00-10:25 Church (Worship) from 10:30 to 11:30.

In an effort to be consistent with three Cs, the idea of calling worship Communion was a concern to Session members since it easily could be interpreted as the sacrament of Communion, implying that Communion would take place each Sunday.

The Session unanimously approved the proposed schedule to be implemented beginning September 12. At the Session Retreat in January the schedule will be evaluated, and any needed changes will be made at that time. The decision emphasized the need to ensure worship services are consistently a blend of traditional and contemporary structures and music.
