Vital Congregation

Happy New Year, MVPC!

You often heard me say that 2021 was a liminal time. We straddled the threshold between the proverbial Covid world and normal life. As we begin 2022, I believe we are more or less stepping out of the Covid realm and while that does not mean the pandemic is over, it does mean that we have learned to navigate life amid its ever-mutating presence.

Moving forward with this understanding, this past fall a group of Session members formed an ad hoc task force that became known as the Mission and Ministry Planning Team. Isaac and I met with these five officers to discuss what was next for the church. Much brainstorming led us in many different directions but with no definitive clarity.

Beginning in October, however, we were notified that the Presbytery, our regional body of churches, was sponsoring a cohort of churches to go through a review process to discern current and future communal gifts. This cohort is called the Vital Congregations Initiative, or VCI. Last month, our Session approved a plan for Mount Vernon Presbyterian to be a part of this cohort which will begin this month.

What is VCI? It is a multistep process that allows churches to pray, discern, and analyze who they currently are as a body of Christ and who they want to be. It invites congregations to think about vitality through prayer, visioning, study, preaching, and assessments. Throughout the year as your pastoral staff gets more exposed to the curriculum, we in turn will collaborate with you on how best to discern our vital marks as we take this next step.





Summary of Session Meeting December 19

The Session met on December 19 for its regular monthly meeting. Following is a summary of the meeting:

The Finance and Administration Ministry Team reported that pledged giving continues to be strong. At the end of November, we have exceeded the amount pledged for the year. The Session was cautioned, though, that FAMT created a deficit budget for 2021; even with what has been given, we are below where we would be with a fully funded budget. Pledges for 2022 look good; hopefully more will come in as the 2022 budget is being finalized.

Approval was given for the 2022 communion offerings and special offerings.

Three Commissioners – David Barclift, David Hill, and Mary Kilgore – were elected to represent MVPC at the February 12, 2022 Presbytery meeting.

Proposed 2022 fellowship events and dates were presented by the Fellowship Ministry Team and approved by Session.

The date for the Annual Congregational Meeting was set as February 27, 2022. Information regarding this meeting will be announced beginning January 23.

The Session will hold its annual retreat on January 21–22, 2022.

The ordination and installation service for the new class of elders will be during the worship service on January 30.

DEFINITION OF RULING ELDER FROM THE BOOK OF ORDER (G-2.0301)

"As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of word and sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships."
