

Church member, Donna Martin, unveils her 3 paintings, "Father,", "Son", and "Holy Spirit" during the January 23 worship service.







What is your all-time favorite book?

Friday Night Lights. Some of you may know about the movie or the TV show. The book, however, mirrors so much of my childhood. Woven around a town immersed in high school football, it really is a reflection of the divisions that drive many of today's problems: education, race, economics, and the realization that for some, the best nights of their life will happen all before they turn 18.

If you could choose to do anything for a day, what would it be?

I would want to go to one of the 423 National Park sites in the USA. This is something that started in the pandemic and I am hooked. Not sure if I will get to them all, but I aim to try! Thus far, I have been to 46 (throughout my lifetime). Every now and then, I will drag my family out of bed on a Saturday and check another off the list - through admittedly, it's getting to where those drives are becoming longer and longer!

Which would you rather do: wash dishes, mow the lawn, clean the bathroom, or vacuum the house?

Mow the lawn. I didn't get to do this often as a child and even now the house we live in is completely landscaped, but mowing the yard reminds me of my grandfather. He lived on a small cotton farm in dusty west Texas. His yard was no more than the wild weeds that grew until they tumbled down the dirt road. When we visited though, he always had gasoline for his old mower, and I would mow those weeds until I ran out of gas- his "yard" was as many acres as I could mow. I always felt like I accomplished something on those days.

What is your proudest accomplishment?

I am a Father, Husband, and Pastor, and the order of those three identities changes often on an hourly basis. I am most proud when at the end of the day I can take satisfaction in the knowledge that I did the best I could in living out my responsibilities to all three.

What is your favorite family recipe?

My late grandmother made rice broccoli casserole that my mother now makes each Thanksgiving at our house. My father makes a mean chicken fried steak and a scrumptious pecan pie. We'll invite you over sometime!

Summary of Session Meeting & Retreat January 21-22, 2022

The Session holds its annual retreat each January. The regular monthly Session meeting is held as part of the retreat. Following is a summary of the January 21–22, 2022 meeting:

The Session voted in December to hold the MVPC Annual Meeting on February 27. At this meeting the congregation will be presented with the 2022 budget, elect officers for the MVPC Foundation, the MVPC Corporation, and the 2022 Nominating Committee. In addition, the Session is recommending the congregation approve amendments to the church by-laws. Copies of the 2021 Annual Report will be made available to the congregation. Proposed amendments to the by-laws are available for review.

The 2024 Class of Ruling Elders was successfully examined. Those nominated and successfully examined include Pat Bartee, Dee Bradford-Smith, Kyle Cumming, Gloria Gillespie, Malinda Holmes, Beppie Lever, and Mary McClurg. Ordination and Installation will take place on January 30.

The 2022 church budget was approved.

The Annual Statistical Report for 2021 was approved. The report is sent to PC(USA) and becomes part of the MVPC Annual Report distributed at the Annual Meeting.

Session approved continuation of the current Sunday schedule (Conversations, Connections, Church). This schedule will be reviewed prior to the beginning of the summer church schedule.

Session elected David Hill as Clerk of Session and Steve Ray as Church Treasurer for 2022.

The baptism of Clark and Colleen Nelson's four children was approved.

A wedding was approved to be held in the MVPC sanctuary.

Commissioners elected to represent MVPC at the February 12 Presbytery Meeting are David Barclift, Charlie Gray, David Hill, and Mary Kilgore.

The next monthly meeting of the Session is scheduled for February 20.
