How was Christ exalted in his ascension?

Christ was exalted in his ascension in that, having often appeared to and conversed with his apostles after his resurrection, speaking to them of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God and giving them commission to preach the gospel to all nations, he visibly went up into the highest heavens forty days after his resurrection, in our nature and as our head, triumphing over his enemies. He went there to receive gifts for men, to raise up our affections to heaven, and to prepare a place for us, where he himself is and will continue until his second coming at the end of the world.

Written by the Westminster Assembly in the 1640's, the Westminster Confession of Faith and the two subsequent catechisms that came from it. The shorter (intended for children) and longer (to teach the Reformed Faith to parishioners), are the core of confessional statements for all manner of Presbyterians.
