

OUTREACH



The May Communion Offering is for the Day Center and Administrative Office of Family Promise of North Fulton/DeKalb which has recently relocated to the Roswell area. In addition to providing office space for all Family Promise staff, the Day Center is available from 9 – 5 Monday through Friday for families currently enrolled in the program if they have not yet found work. Spaces include a career center with computers to work on resumes and job searches, a playroom and daybeds for children, a kitchenette, a laundry room, and private conference space for counseling and case management. Emergency services such as food and gas cards are also provided by the staff to additional homeless families, some living in their cars, while they wait for placement in a shelter.

The blue "Shopping for Outreach" bags will be available beginning on Sunday, May 1. If you already have a bag at home, a shopping list will also be available for your use.





Summary of Session Meeting April 24, 2022

The Session met on April 24 in its regular monthly meeting. Following is a summary of that meeting:

The Worship Committee will use Elder classes to serve communion. The Class of 2022 will serve in May; each month a different class will serve. If needed Elders not currently on Session will participate.

The Youth group assisted with the annual Easter Egg Hunt and will be providing volunteer support in the near future for CAC.

The Finance and Administration Ministry Team reports that church finances remain on target. The HVAC system in the Sanctuary Building has failed and only part of the system can be repaired. The main system that cools the sanctuary and the first floor classrooms must be replaced. A temporary rental unit has been installed but is inadequate to fully cool the area. The church and school partner in expenses for maintenance and replacement and are working on a long-term solution.

The baptism of Stephen Hagenau has been approved for May 8.

Piper Neumann, our lone confirmand this year, gave her faith statement. The Session approved her confirmation which will be held May 1.

Several members who have moved and are attending other churches were removed from the MVPC rolls.
