OPENING PRAYER

Pentecost originally brought together people 50 days after Passover. That is why "devout Jews from every nation" gathered at Jerusalem and gives the setting for the church to begin and spread quickly. **† CALL TO WORSHIP** (inspired by Acts 2:1-21)

ONE: They came from Phrygia, Pamphylia, and parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene.



In Stephen Ministry, we start at the beginning: we talk about it first, unloading our pain and loneliness and lack of a sense of safety and comfort. Having someone there to simply listen and hear us is relieving. Then we begin to look for small steps and actions that can bring us back to equilibrium. It is a blessing to have a "first step" program like Stephen Ministry available to our congregation and our community for any who are dealing with multiple issues or losses.
