








Family Promise

- A thank you note was received from Los Ninos Primero thanking MVPC for a successful Los Ninos Sunday and the hospitality we extended by hosting the cookout that followed the service.
- The Witness Ministry Team reports that almost all of the slots for providing refreshments and serving during the Connections time between Sunday School and Church have been filled. We are so thankful for our newer members who have jumped in to be part of this fellowship opportunity.
- A joint effort between MVPC and Pleasant Hill PC has been underway to share ideas of how to strengthen the Senior Adult programs and services in the two churches. The MVPC Witness and Senior Adult Ministry Teams are partnering in this work.
- The Finance and Administration Ministry Team announced we continue to be on track with member giving. Bids are being received to address purchase and installation of a new HVAC system. This will be a long process that will likely last well into next year.

- Family Promise just completed a two-week stay on our campus. Penny Kiel is the MVPC coordinator on our campus and it was noted the program functions very smoothly as a result of Penny's excellent organization of this vital service to homeless families.
