### A Letter From The Pastor

#### Serving the Community

Friends, on Sunday October 23 we will celebrate Stewardship Sunday during worship. By the time you read this, I hope you will have read the campaign letter we mailed to the congregation. Within that letter is our theme for the year: Serving the Community. Throughout our history, Mount Vernon has been a place of communal gathering. Recently, I asked some of your fellow church members what it means to serve the community. Here are some of their responses:

### Following is a summary of the meeting:



- The Senior Adult Team is planning a leaf tour trip to north Georgia on October 22.

- Three Ministry Teams Fellowship, Christina Education, and Witness – are working on plans for the annual Pumpkin Palooza event scheduled for October 23.
- The Session elects Commissioners to represent our church at Presbytery Meetings. Representing MVPC at the November 12 meeting are Mary McClurg, Gloria Gillespie, Malinda Holmes, and Dee Bradford-Smith.
- The theme for this year's Stewardship campaign is "Serving the Community."
- Session approved serving Communion in the worship service on September 25.

Alone or with a partner, find a place on our campus (or your home) to be. You may stand, sit, or walk. Take time to recognize your breath. Invite God to be with you where you are. When you feel ready, engage your senses:
