One of those constants on that list is the phrase "connect with visitors/members," and if I know a specific person, I will write their name ever so small on the same line. Come the next Tuesday when I return to the office, after our staff meeting, I begin the process of connecting with those members and visitors. It's the first thing I focus on during the week. Perhaps it entails- as it did the week of this writingwalking down to the Village or the Towers to check in on some of our members, maybe it means writing a recent visitor a card letting them know how grateful we







Summary of Session Meeting

Stated Session Meeting November 20, 2022

Following is a summary of work completed at the November Session Meeting:

- · As part of the training for incoming Elders, Meg Christian and Braegan Abernethy were in attendance. Htet Nyunt attended the October meeting.
- · Thank you, letters were received from AMIS, as well as from the Alliance for Children Everywhere for Mount Vernon's ongoing financial support for these organizations that are part of our Outreach Ministry.
- The Congregational Care Ministry Team continues its search for a co-director of the Stephen Ministry.
- · Fellowship events for 2023 have been set and will be announced in the near future. The first event of the new year will be a Winter Dinner on Sunday, Feb. 5th from 6-8 PM.
- · Plans to replace the HVAC system in the Sanctuary Building continue to move forward. The first part of the work will be removal of a small amount of asbestos that covers pipes in the area where the HVAC equipment is located. This work is scheduled to be done when the Mount Vernon School has its Christmas break.
- The Finance and Administration Ministry Team (FAMT) is asking for anyone who hasn't already done so to please get their 2023 pledge cards in. Ministry teams are currently working on proposed budget needs for next year.

- · Prior to the Christmas Eve service, the live Nativity scene will be in the courtyard beginning at 4:45. The Witness Ministry Team will provide a hot chocolate bar and music will be provided.
- · Thanks to those who volunteer to provide snacks for Connections. Right now, we have the volunteer slots filled through April!
- The church youth are engaged in a couple of outreach projects: one involves helping the Sandy Springs Education Force sort books for children while another involves purchasing gifts for the Memorial Drive ministry.
- · Several people were removed from the church rolls who now reside outside of the Sandy Springs area and are attending other churches. One of those Glenn Grove was received as an Affiliate Member since he wants to continue to provide his financial expertise to FAMT. Glenn has moved his membership to a church in Chattanooga.
- · Commissioners who attended the November Presbytery meeting (Mary McClurg, Malinda Holmes, Dee Bradford-Smith, and Gloria Gillespie) reported on the work of that meeting which included approval of amendments to the Book of Order. These amendments must be approved by a majority of the presbyteries around the country. At the next several meetings Commissioners will be voting on other Book of Order amendments.

•The next Stated Session Meeting will be December 18.
