† AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (8.22-8.24 of the Barmen Declaration)

"Fear God. Honor the emperor." (I Peter 2:17)

Scripture tells us that, in the as yet unredeemed world in which the Church also exists, the State has by divine appointment the task of providing for justice and peace. [It fulfills this task] by means of the threat and exercise of force, according to the measure of human judgment and human ability. The church acknowledges the benefit of this divine appointment in gratitude and reverence before God. It calls to mind the Kingdom of God, God's commandment, and righteousness, and thereby the responsibility both of rulers and of the ruled. It trusts and obeys the power of the Word by which God upholds all things.

We reject the false doctrine, as though the State, over and beyond its special commission, should and could become the single and totalitarian order of human life, thus fulfilling the church's vocation as well.

We reject the false doctrine, as though the church, over and beyond its special commission, should and could appropriate the characteristics, the tasks, and the dignity of the State, thus itself becoming an organ of the State.

The Barmen Declaration was written by German **Protestants in** May 1934 in response to Hitler's Nazi movement gaining more and more power in church affairs. This particular passage speaks to the role of the church vs. the role of the state; something we are called to ponder by the presence of both state and church flags in our sanctuary.
