Survey Says...

Happy New Year to you and yours!
May Christ bless your house and all the houses (to ring in the new year in the spirit of the Magi see the Chalking of the Door liturgy within this newsletter) you encounter this coming year.

As we begin 2023, we will begin our second and final year within the Vital Congregations Initiative (VCI). On Sunday, January 8th, we will continue this journey of discernment and exploration during a unique worship service. On this particular Sunday, we will set aside

15-20 minutes for you all to take the Congregational Vitality Survey.

You may ask why are we doing this during church? Good question. For starters, we are doing this survey during Baptism of the Lord Sunday. This specific Sunday is a perfect time to ponder and wonder about our identity as individual Christians and as a body of Christ. This survey was designed by PCUSA Christian Educators in collaboration with theologians and sociologists. It will feel and look very much like a survey you do online or receive in the mail from time to time.

Yet, we hope responding to the survey during worship will bring a spiritual component. You will take this alongside your neighbors, your brothers and sisters, and one can be sure there will be different answers to different questions, yet as the comfort and familiarity of the sanctuary reminds us, we are all connected by a grace that is unbound. Once completed, the survey will assess the Seven Marks of what makes a Vital Congregation (discipleship, evangelism, outward focus, servant leadership, worship, caring relationships, and ecclesial health). Hopefully, these results will lead us to explore growing edges and embrace of our strengths so we may live into our

communal vow to raise one another in the faith of Jesus Christ. A vow, as you likely recall, is proclaimed during baptism, hence why we will take this survey during this service.

I hope you will view this survey as an opportunity. As a confessing church, we confess what we believe, and we write that statement down from time to time. It is a spiritual exercise that reminds us why we enter the household of faith, and baptism is that visible sign of entry into God's invisible grace. This will serve as a guide for the rest of the year as the Holy Spirit continues to mold us into the people we are and strive to be.



An Invitation to Chalk Your Door at Home

An old Epiphany tradition involves writing the letters CMB and the numbers of the current year, separated by crosses (+), over the doors of Christian homes and sanctuaries. This year would look like this:

$$20 + C + M + B + 23$$

The letters CMB are said to stand for the traditional names of the Magi (Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar) or the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" (Christ bless this house).

Grab a piece of chalk to carry on the tradition! Gather your household around the front door and write "20 + C + M + B + 23" across the top of your door, then offer this prayer in unison:

Holy God, you have led many people to these doors. Some from near, some from far. Some with immediate needs, some with precious gifts. Some full of questions, some full of knowing. We ask your blessing on this ordinary bit of chalk that it may mark these doors as extraordinary. May these marks be a welcome invitation for all who are led here this year, and a constant prayer for the nourishment and safety of this sanctuary. Amen.

Taize Returns

We are glad to announce that after a hiatus, we are bringing the Taize Prayer service back. This service will take place every fourth Wednesday at 8:15pm.

What is Taize? This is a service of songs, silence, and scripture. It began in 1940 amid the violence of World War II in France. In line with these beginnings, Taize prayer is intended to suspend time for the parishioner. The simplistic songs are meant to be a chant that become prayers, while the silence invites one to talk to God, or more importantly, for God to speak to you.

SESSION MEETING SUMMARY

Stated Session Meeting December 18, 2022

The monthly Session Meeting considered the following items of business:

- Thank you letters were received from several organizations: the John Mohr Mackintosh Pipes and Drums regarding their participation in the October 30 service and for allowing them to use our campus as their rehearsal site; the Alliance for Children Everywhere for our monthly donation to support the school in Zambia; Presbyterian College reporting on the status of MVPC endowment funds; and Family Promise for a recent donation.
- · The Finance and Administration Ministry Team reported that the congregation continues to provide financial support beyond what was budgeted for 2022.
- · Stated Session Meeting dates for 2023 were approved. The Session will not meet in June or November. All meetings will be on the third Sunday with the exception of December when the meeting will be on the second Sunday.
- · Communion dates were approved for 2023.
- · Special Offering dates were approved for 2023.

· In its capacity as the Trustees of the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church Corporation, the Session approved two resolutions (the same two resolutions approved by the congregation in the Called Congregational Meeting) regarding terms of the loan for replacement of the Sanctuary Building HVAC system.

I listen to WABE (NPR) and The Message---contemporary Christian interchangeably. I'm always ready to sing along.






