




New Outreach Ministry Team Member, Piper Neumann, worked with Christy Hill to completely refresh the Outreach Bulletin Board.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT Barbara Hughes





Barbara shared her long-time love of Zambia, how it began, and why it matters so much: I traveled to Zimbabwe and Zambia with Bill and Nancy Warwick from The Outreach Foundation over 20 years ago. Bill and Nancy had visited Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church several times and would come to inform us about the on-going outreach programs in these African countries. Mount Vernon was already supporting some of them.

In 2000, I traveled with a mission team to visit several outreach sites in Zimbabwe and Zambia. It is very simple to explain my dedication to Alliance for Children Everywhere for all these years. Within a few minutes at the House of Moses (HOM), I knew this was why my Lord had brought me to Zambia! After meeting and listening to the story of the two grandmothers who founded this ministry and visiting the nursery with 12 precious new lives (many had been abandoned or the mother died in childbirth), I knew that this was my calling.

During these 20 years, I have seen how God has blessed this ministry in so many ways. I have watched when a policeman or someone from the Zambian Social Services bring to the HOM a new baby who needs care. I watched and listened when the caregiver would gently take the screaming baby in for initial evaluation, bathe, and dress him, cuddle and pray for him, and then feed him. And in no time, there is silence...

I have had the opportunity to travel with many church members as part of several mission teams I organized. We were there to visit the House of Moses and the Bill and Bette Nursery, the 7 Faith Works Schools held in different churches, the High School in one of the largest compounds, and to help distribute formula and food to women with babies in the poorest of the poor areas, to worship with the caregivers and staff every day, etc.

Before the trip, most travelers have a very different perception of Africa and her people. At the final dinner, usually after 2-3 weeks, I ask them to tell me what was "heartbreaking" and what they found was "breathtaking". The first observance was always easy – the poverty and all the associated problems. But the breathtaking was always a surprise to them – the faithfulness to God of the people, their joy in music, the determination of the students to be successful at school, the beauty of God's creation, and on and on.

I have enjoyed being back on The Alliance for Children Everywhere Board as Treasurer. This is another area where God has truly blessed this work. Most recently, the organization has worked to help write the laws that allow a child to be fostered and/or adopted. This is the Organization's Strategic Objective: "that a child belongs in a permanent, secure, loving and caring home." The program is now in place which includes recruiting prospective families for foster care and adoption, home assessments, and training families. I am looking forward to visiting Zambia in June and meeting some of these families.

Statistics from the 2022 Annual Report speak for themselves:

88 children served in crisis homes

311 families provided nutrition support

1,891 educated students, 95% pass rate for Grade 7 (Zambian Government Tests)

372 educated high school students, 100% pass rate for Grade 12 (Zambian Government Tests)

Thank you again, Mount Vernon members, for all your support through the years.

PRESBYTERIAN ORDINATION Shari Freeman









For several years I sensed that God was calling me to seminary, but I took no action. After I retired from my corporate career, I started to take the question of seminary more seriously, and after several months of discernment, I applied to Columbia Theological Seminary. When I started seminary, I knew I would eventually need to decide about vocation and ordination. After a few months into my seminary internship with Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church, I knew I wanted to work in congregational ministry, which meant I needed to seriously engage the question of ordination. I sought counsel from Barrett and Isaac, friends and professors at Columbia, and others I have worked with in ministry. Eventually, I felt confident that God was leading me to PCUSA ordination.

My PCUSA ordination journey officially started in April 2022 when I joined Mount Vernon. Six months later, in October 2022, the session received training from the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta on the ordination process and voted to take me under their care as I work through it. I have applied to be an inquirer for ordination, and I am hopeful that I will be accepted after completing a psychological assessment in March (wish me luck!). After one year as an inquirer, I will move to the candidate phase of ordination. During this period, I must take five different ordination exams. I took the first exam on Bible content on February 4, 2023, and thankfully I passed it! The final four exams focus on exegesis, theology, Presbyterian polity, and worship.

God has led and provided resources for me throughout this journey, from Columbia Seminary to Mount Vernon, and now applying for PCUSA ordination. The ordination process in the Presbyterian church is daunting and somewhat intimidating, so I continue to seek discernment and place trust in God as I move step-by-step through this process. I am thankful for the Mount Vernon congregation's pivotal role in this process.




How do you like to spend your free time?



SESSION MEETING SUMMARY

Stated Session Meeting February 19, 2023

Following is a summary of the meeting:

- · Finance & Administration reported the HVAC system replacement loan was finalized in late January and the financial statement now reflects receipt of loan funds. In addition, member giving is strong here at the first of the year. Negotiations continue between the church and the school to finalize the MOU which outlines the cost sharing agreement for capital expenses that allows the school to use the MVPC campus.
- · Everyone is encouraged to wear blue on February 26 in support of the PC(USA) Presbyterian Disaster Relief Fund.
- The Senior Adult ministry includes an upcoming trip for the group. In addition, the group continues its project to support the Sandy Springs Education Alliance (SSEF). The ministry team has created an information center for Seniors.
- The Youth continue work sorting books for the Sandy Springs Education Alliance (SSEF).
- · Session determined dates on which ministry teams will meet after the worship service for collaborative work. The congregation is encouraged to join in on these dates to participate in the work of these ministry teams.
- •The Church Nominating Committee is composed of two members elected by Session and three additional members elected by the congregation at the Annual Meeting. Representing Session will be Gloria Gillespie and Amy Kiley.

- · Session accepted the resignation of Angie Hawthorne from Session and the Hawthorne's request to be removed from the church rolls.
- · An additional date for Communion was approved. Communion will be served on Ascension of the Lord Sunday which is May 21.
- · A report was given regarding the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta meeting on February 11. Following the PC(USA) General Assembly meeting last summer, presbyteries around the county must vote on proposed amendments to the Book of Order. This is taking place in our presbytery over four different meetings. Rev. Abernethy and David Hill (member of the Presbytery Bills and Overtures Committee) can respond to questions regarding the various proposed amendments.
- · The church and the City of Sandy Springs are in negotiations regarding church property that will be impacted by the upcoming work on Mount Vernon Hwy and Johnson Ferry Rd. A committee made up of David Barclift, Steve Ray, John Hibbard, and Rev. Abernethy are involved in this work.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be March 19.
