Leaving a Legacy

On Sunday, May 7 MVPC will celebrate Legacy Sunday. Legacy Sunday is an opportunity for the church as a whole and individuals like you to prayerfully consider how the Saints that follow you can serve God and live out God's mission here at Mount Vernon. In my relatively short tenure as your pastor, I can tell you these gifts have proven to be critical to sustaining the mission of the church. Here are some examples:

Sustains the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation

Gifts that have been given at the time of death to the Mount Vernon Presbyterian Foundation have been critical to the mission mindset that shapes the core of the MVPC identity. Through gifts from people that you have shared the pews with, the Foundation Board has been able to fund priorities within the church (Youth mission trips in the past and more recently the Seminary Intern position held by Shari Freeman), as well as priorities for our mission partners (CAC, Los Niños Primero, Alliance for Children Everywhere, The Mount Vernon School, and others). To date, your gifts have allowed more than \$500,000 to be given to various mission partners.

Enables MVPC to Meet Infrastructure Needs

Last year with the church needing sufficient funds to meet their share of costs to replace an aging HVAC unit in the sanctuary, MVPC was blessed with an anonymous gift. This gift had been planned by the donor to be received upon their death, but seeing the great need in the present, this person was kind enough to go ahead and bequeath the funds. This allowed us to do two important things: (1) We were able to meet our financial obligations and (2) do so without further dipping into our reserve funds. As you know, our church plant is significant and the need to meet these important needs will only grow over time. Giving a gift of this kind will be essential to the church sustaining its mission.

Endow a Particular Ministry

Leaving a Legacy can also be a gift to a particular ministry. Each Sunday, our church benefits from having paid staff singers bolster the joyful noise we ring in God's name.

This is partially due to a fund left in the name of Polly Russell. Polly and her husband, Gadson (Gad), were longtime church members and lived, coincidentally, in the Mount Vernon Woods home now owned by Steve and Shelley Ray. Because of this Legacy gift, we are able to enjoy a more fulfilling worship experience. There are many ministries you can endow- from children to music, personnel to missionwe encourage you to speak with some of our church leaders and share with them what you want to help sustain.

We hope you will join us May 7. Whether you are ready to leave a legacy or want to simply learn more at our Fox Brothers BBQ luncheon afterward, we hope you will be present so together we can envision a sustainable future.


WORSHIP

Hannah Hagenau thanks you! Thank you to everyone who has donated to the Garden Hill Scholarship Fund for over the past 6 years! The impact that these donations have made is immeasurable! Thanks to your support we have paid the tuition for an average of 31 students a year, with 2023 having a record high of 49 students (significantly more than the first class of 14). This group of students includes 10 eighth graders, 10 ninth graders, 15 tenth graders, 11 eleventh graders, and 3 twelfth graders. The three seniors are Benson Mumba, who has been sponsored since 10th grade, Angela Musonda, who was sponsored in 11th grade, and Kutawila Mwengani, who has been sponsored since 9th grade. All three of these students likely would have been unable to complete their secondary school education without the support of the congregation.



SEVEN SCHOOLS EVENTS

Last year we piloted a new campaign to help renovate each of our seven FaithWorks schools in Zambia. In seven major cities across the United States (Seattle, Portland, Los Angeles, Grand Rapids, Tucson, Houston, Atlanta). With seven in-person events, you listened and learned about all the ways that God is working on the ground in Zambia and what more is in store. As our FaithWorks schools help students perform at a high percentile, the demand is evergrowing to enroll. Last year, you helped break ground on new classrooms to accommodate more students, fences to secure school campuses, build new restrooms and give access to electricity to each of our community schools. Education is a globally recognized solution to help solve poverty and through your giving, vulnerable children in Zambia today can become the changemakers of tomorrow. With rising food costs and economic instability, you also helped us raise the salaries of teachers who not only are educators but role models, confidants, and advocates for our students. Many students in our FaithWorks schools have felt so touched by our programs that upon graduation, they themselves return to their alma mater not as students, but as teachers. Thank you for keeping the chain of change-making going, and helping to expand the reach of quality education to some of the most materially poor children in Zambia.



Who is your hero?


I suppose God/Jesus/the Holy Spirt is my three-in-one hero.

SESSION MEETING SUMMARY

Stated Session Meeting April 16, 2023

The Session met in its regular monthly meeting on April 16. Following is a summary of that meeting:

- The Finance and Administration Ministry
 Team gave the Session an update of the
 ongoing discussions with Mount Vernon
 School regarding revisions to the
 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).
 The MOU describes the financial sharing
 arrangements between the church and
 school related to repairs and upkeep of the
 campus buildings and grounds as well as
 funding a capital reserve account to pay for
 major expenses (such as replacing the HVAC
 system). The MOU has been updated several
 times over the years, but the current MOU
 has not been updated since 2014, five years
 beyond its scheduled revision date.
- The Outreach Ministry Team reported that Family Promise has approved Misty Creek Church as a Family Promise partner congregation. They will work with MVPC and B'nai Torah when we host Family Promise twice each year.
- · Session is proposing a trip to a Braves game following the worship service on a Sunday in June or July. Charlie Gray is getting information about group tickets.

- The Session heard a report on the annual financial audit. Everything is good. The audit committee suggests the church create a financial procedures handbook.
- · Commissioners were elected for the May 2 Presbytery meeting. Representing MVPC will be Malinda Holmes, David Hill, David Barclift, and Pat Bartee.
- · Rev. Abernethy reported on a very successful Holy Week with excellent attendance at the various Holy Week services.
- · With the HVAC repair to begin soon in the Sanctuary Building, we will move worship services to Fellowship Hall beginning June 4.



The next Stated Session Meeting will be May 21.
