












OUTREACH

Our September Communion Offering brought in over \$1000 worth of School Supplies that were given to Stirred Up Ministries and the Teacher's Supply Closet, a collaboration of the Sandy Springs Education Force (SSEF) and the Community Assistance Center (CAC), which is available for teachers to request required classroom supplies for their economically disadvantaged students.

Nine years ago we established the Zambia College Fund for deserving students. These students must have successfully completed high school, be very bright, motivated, and demonstrate extreme financial need. The fields of study include Health Sciences, Clinical Medical Sciences, Pharmacy, Education, Engineering and Culinary Arts. We strive to keep nine to ten students enrolled in college at all times.

Vandetta Mulenga graduated with her degree in Clinical Medicine in 2018. She is presently employed as a volunteer clinical officer in Rural Health for the Ministry of Health's Outpatient Department (OPD), where her duties include managing and diagnosing patients clinically and referring them to larger hospitals as necessary. In addition to her regular community outreach activities, she is hoping to further her education to become a surgeon and a mental health activist.



In 2021, Priscovia Daka received her diploma in secondary education. She is mostly interested in teaching and learning as a means of assisting the community. While she waits to be deployed by the government, she is now employed in the private sector.

Lloyd Chama graduated from HDCS and was offered a college scholarship to study to become a Pharmacist. As a graduate working for the Zambian government in the rural areas, he is employed as a district pharmacist in the Ministry of Health. He owes it all to God for transforming his life and his tale, he is incredibly appreciative of the organization.





Rosemary Mumba earned a Bachelor of Arts with Education from the University in 2021. She used to be a child who resided in the House of Martha, which was the first crisis nursery run by ACE. She is currently employed by the Zambian Army as an instructor. "She uses a powerful force in the workplace, and her positive attitude is to encourage learners to work hard and succeed."



Suzyo Nyirenda is a former student of HDCS and one of the Stewart Scholars in the class of 2017. In 2019 she was offered a sponsorship to study Registered Nursing, and she completed her degree in 2021.

Currently, she waits to be deployed by the government. she is working as an intern at a private clinic.



SESSION MEETING SUMMARY

Stated Session Meeting October 15, 2023

The Session met on October 15 for its monthly meeting. Following is a summary of that meeting:

- Rev. Abernethy is contacting various ministry partners and asking them to participate in Advent candle lighting this year.
- The Finance and Administration Ministry team has been working with Mount Vernon School to update the Memorandum of Understanding which defines the financial responsibilities of both church and school in maintaining the MVPC campus. The MOU has been finalized and signed.
- The Outreach Ministry Team announced a trip to Zambia is being planned for July 10-24, 2024.
- The Safety Committee has worked over the past few months to create a church safety policy that addresses four area of safety: medical, fire, weather, and intruder. The committee presented the policy which was approved by the Session.
- MVPC Commissioners who will represent MVPC at the November 4th Presbytery Meeting were elected. These include Gloria Gillespie, David Hill, Beppie Lever, and Malinda Holmes.
- Communion dates for 2024 were approved.

The next Session Meeting will be December 10.
