## A Note From The Pastor

Last month, a parent from the school reached out to me and asked if I would serve on an interfaith panel that they are hosting on Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. When I asked this kind person what I should share as a panel speaker, they replied, "Share your history, the central tenants of your faith, and how you are living out that sense of mission."

As a Presbyterian, I must confess our record of living out King's hope of creating a "beloved community" is decidedly mixed. Next month, on Sunday February 4th, we will host Professor William Yoo from Columbia Seminary. In his recent

book What Kind of Christianity: A History of Slavery and Anti-Black Racism in the Presbyterian Church, he writes that during the Antebellum Period, Presbyterian clergy were responsible for more proslavery writings than clergy from any other Christian tradition. This would make sense as the planter class usually came from wealthier families, which in U.S. Protestantism have been the Presbyterians and the Episcopalians. Hence, the type of Christianity that Presbyterian clergy emphasized championed piety of the enslaved over freedom. As Yoo notes, the theology offered was "antithetical to the Christian gospel and insulting to Black Americans."

These choices, or rather lack thereof, illustrate why so few enslaved joined the Presbyterian Church and have reverberated throughout the generations as the PCUSA remains 90% white to this day.

Yet when Dr. King also said that the "arc of the moral universe is long, but that it points to justice" he could have been talking about the Presbyterians. As you likely know, the PCUSA is a confessing church. What this means is that we confess what we believe. We do this every Sunday in the form of the affirmation of faith that immediately follows the sermon. One of the confessions that we often draw upon is the Confession of 1967. This confession, as the title suggests, points out that the faithful inspired to write it were influenced by the theological doctrines of people like Dr. King. You see this truth most clearly in paragraph 9.44:

"... Therefore, the church labors for the abolition of all racial discrimination and ministers to those injured by it.

Congregations, individuals, or groups of Christians who exclude, dominate, or patronize their fellowmen, however subtly resist the Spirit of God and bring contempt on the faith which they profess."

This confession's sentiment has largely held true since 1967. I believe that we are a denomination that, though imperfect, tries sincerely to bear witness to this statement and others like it. At Mount Vernon Presbyterian you have lived this in your own way. Helping to start the Community Assistance Center and Los Niños Primero are clear examples, while The Mount Vernon School has increasingly leaned in to being a school that wants diversity and inclusion to be central to its values.

As we enter our 70th year, I wonder what our community will look like well into the future. I don't have many answers, but I know that Dr. King's dream of a beloved community is one worth considering, after all it mirrors the Pentecost story in Acts 2 when the Holy Spirit dwelled within all humanity.

# CHALKING THE DOOR SHARI FREEMAN



Have you wondered about the meaning of the letters and numbers on the doors to the sanctuary? These markings tie to a medieval European tradition associated with Epiphany. Many Christians, including Anglicans, Lutherans, Methodists, Presbyterians, and Roman Catholics, write on their doors with chalk at the beginning of the new year. This Christian custom has a biblical precedent, as the Israelites in the Hebrew Bible marked their doors in order to be saved from death (Exodus 12). Christians today view this act as a house blessing, inviting the presence of God in one's home for the new year.

The markings for 2024 are "20 + C + M + B + 24". The numbers refer to the year. The letters C, M, and B have two meanings. First, they stand for the traditional names of the Magi from Matthew 2 – Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also stand for the Latin blessing Christus mansionem benedicat, which means "May Christ bless this house." The crosses between the letters represent Christ.

Here at Mount Vernon, we will celebrate Epiphany on December 31, and, in keeping with our Epiphany tradition, we will chalk the sanctuary's doors for the new year. You can also chalk the door to your home. All you need to do is find some chalk and write the markings across the top of your door. Here is a prayer to accompany your door-chalking service at home.

Lord Jesus, through your Incarnation and birth in human form, you have made all the earth holy. We now ask your blessing upon this simple gift of your creation – chalk. We use it as a tool to teach our children, and they use it as a tool in their play and games. Now, with your blessing, may it become a tool for us to mark the doors of our church home with the symbols of your wise servants, who, so long ago, came to worship and adore you in your first home.

May we, in this house, and all who come to visit, work, and worship, remember these things throughout the coming year. May all who come and go here find peace, comfort, joy, hope, love, and salvation, for Christ has come to dwell in this house and in these hearts.

May we be Christ's light in the world. Amen



## VITAL CONGREGATIONS



At the final Presbytery meeting of the year this past November, Rev. Isaac Toney-Schmitt shared our church's experience engaging in the Vital Congregations Initiative (VCI). As you may recall, this two year commitment allowed our church to explore our vitality and assess our communal gifts. One thing that has come out of this work includes our new tagline: Reaching Out to...Welcome. Worship. Share. Serve. Even though VCI has formally concluded, its work continues through the Mission and Ministry Committee which is currently looking at updating our website and physical signage on our campus, among other potential plans.

The Rev. Isaac Toney-Schmitt of Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church in Sandy Springs, Georgia, admits practical motives for joining the initiative. "It came from a desire to do a church-wide survey after the pandemic ... and the survey was more cost-effective than the other options." He appreciated how the process did not lead with a survey but with storytelling that allowed Mount Vernon to delve into its nearly 70-year history. "Because of the intentional, thoughtful storytelling work done prior to that survey, we were able to look at the results of that survey with excitement and hope." The church updated their church tagline and are beginning a digital rebrand through what they learned about themselves through the VCI process.

#### Summary of December 10, 2023, Session Meeting

The MVPC Session met in its regularly scheduled meeting on December 10. Following is a summary of that meeting:

- Commissioners for the February 4 Presbytery meeting were elected. Those representing MVPC will be Dee Bradford-Smith, Mary McClurg, Keith Bumgarner, and Lois Johnson. Mount Vernon will be hosting the November 9 Presbytery meeting on our campus so Session members will be closely observing how the Presbytery meetings are organized. Session will be calling on members to help us prepare for almost 400 Presbyterians from across Atlanta who will participate in that meeting.
- Session meeting dates for 2024 were approved. Session meetings will be on the third Sunday of the month with the following exceptions: January 26-27 (Session will meet during its annual retreat), May/June (there will be no meeting in May and the June meeting will be on June 9), and November/December (there will be no November meeting and the December meeting will be on December 8).
- Approval was given for the various special offerings and outreach offerings for 2024. Information regarding outreach ministry offerings will always be announced in church publications throughout the year.
- The church Safety Committee will continue work on safety procedures. In January the committee will ask for additional input from some member regarding how we will address possible threats of violence.
- The Session elected Amy Kiley to fill the MVPC position on the Clifton Ministries Board created by the recent retirement of Carol Beckman. Carol served faithfully in this position for many years.
- Rev. Abernethy will serve as part of an interfaith panel discussion that will be part of the Dr. Martin Luther King holiday celebration.
