OPENING PRAYER

+ CALL TO WORSHIP

ONE: We see the Celtic Cross around our campus: in the narthex, on our buildings.

ALL: This cross originated in the early middle ages and came with the Scotch-Irish Presbyterians of yesteryear.

ONE: We know it's a cross, but it looks different.

ALL: The nimbus, or circle surrounding the cross, represents the eternal light of Christ.

ONE: May God lead us to the cross this day to proclaim that through Christ there is a new heaven and a new earth.

ALL: Let us worship the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End, the Eternal Light of Christ.

The Celtic Cross is often associated with the large and ornately carved stone crosses (called high crosses) in Ireland and Scotland.

"The Crosses of Mount Vernon: Celtic Cross"

RESPONSE

+ AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (from the Scots Confession)

We confess:

That our Lord Jesus offered himself a voluntary sacrifice unto his Father for us, that he suffered contradiction of sinners, that he was wounded and plagued for our transgressions, that he, the clean innocent Lamb of God, was condemned in the presence of an earthly judge, that we should be absolved before the judgment seat of our God; that he suffered not only the cruel death of the cross, which was accursed by the sentence of God; but also that he suffered for a season the wrath of his Father which sinners had deserved. But yet we avow that he remained the only, well beloved, and blessed Son of his Father even in the midst of his anguish and torment which he suffered in body and soul to make full atonement for the sins of his people.

The Scots Confession, written in 1560, was the first reformed confession of faith for the Protestant Church in Scotland.

From this we confess and avow that there remains no other sacrifice for sin; if any affirm so, we do not hesitate to say that they are blasphemers against Christ's death and the everlasting atonement thereby purchased for us. Amen.
