Monday March 25: Inquiry

We will turn from Holy Week/Lent and enter into the brightness of Easter morn with our annual Sunrise Service on the courtyard at 7am followed by worship in the sanctuary at 10:30am. If you have not yet had your directory picture taken, we will have one final makeup following worship so we can have our new directories ready for our 70th Anniversary Worship Service on May 19.

A busy week to conclude the month at MVPC as we will fully live out our mission to Welcome, Worship, Share, and Serve. We hope to see you!

OUTREACH



The Outreach Ministry Team expresses gratitude for your very generous donations to the Community Assistance Center in January. We donated **192 pounds of non-perishable food and toiletries**. We also received many diaper donations for the South Sandy Springs Food Pantry location. We were able to donate five large boxes of disposable face masks to CAC (leftovers from pandemic bulk buying) which freed up some much-needed storage space in Gailey Hall.

We are grateful for an increase to the Outreach budget, which will allow us to give financial support to our outreach partners at Community Assistance Center, International Women's House and Sandy Springs Education Force, in addition to continuing to collect donations for them through our Monthly Communion Offering. We will also be able to supplement our Special Offerings and support needs that come up at the local public schools.

The February Communion Offering is for Clifton Sanctuary Ministries and the March Communion Offering will be for the Student Food Pantry at Columbia Theological Seminary.

GIFTS OF WISDOM

"Gifts of Wisdom 2.0 -- Welcome"

Through the pandemic, "The MVPC Members' Gift of Wisdom" publication created space for our church members to share their insights and perspectives. The topics were varied: care for the environment, care for one another in Stephen Ministry, attention to the financial markets, resources for understanding systemic racism, reports from the Presbyterian Women, articles on the Marks of Vital Congregations from the Vital Congregations Initiative, and, occasionally, poetry. Each article sought to unite a particular topic with a members' knowledge of the topic and that members' understanding of scripture. Those of us who wrote articles for the publication noted that MVPC is unique to have a publication written and produced almost entirely by lay people.

We will continue to write and share "The MVPC Members' Gift of Wisdom," but in a new format: right here! Rather than a quarterly publication we will share bits of wisdom monthly in our Good News. Hopefully this brings a broader audience, and(!) encourages our readers to submit their own bits of wisdom.

Every day, we live into our tag line as a church reaching out to welcome, worship, share, and serve. Most often we live into the call to "welcome" by opening our doors to new folks and inviting everyone into a common space of worship. But, we welcome fellow members too! We open the doors to Sunday school rooms, invite members to be elders, encourage one another to serve on committees, stand behind tables of yummy treats in the narthex, and(!) make space to hear one another's perspectives in publications like this one. The welcoming culture is alive and well at MVPC, and I encourage you to take hold of the invitation.

40 DAYS AND 40 NIGHTS SHARI FREEMAN



As you read this newsletter, you may find yourself in the middle of Lent. Lent is the period of 40 days (excluding Sundays) that lead to Easter. The season of Lent is an opportunity for growth in our faith through prayer, spiritual discipline, and self-examination, all done in preparation for the upcoming celebration of the death and resurrection of Christ at Easter.

The pattern of fasting and prayer for 40 days is found in several places in Scripture. In the New Testament, the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke all mention the 40 days when Jesus went into the desert to fast and pray and experience temptations from Satan after his Baptism. This pattern is also seen in the Old Testament. Moses went into the mountains for 40 days to pray and fast before receiving the Ten Commandments (Exodus 24). The prophet Elijah spent 40 days in the mountains fasting and praying before meeting God at Mount Horeb (1 Kings 19). There are other 40s in the Bible, including 40 days of rain in Genesis 7, Jonah's warning to Ninevah, and the Israelites wandering for 40 years in the desert.

The Bible stories of 40 days (or years) teach us about the power of faith, repentance, and grace to transform our lives. As we embrace the 40-day journey of Lent, we can deepen our faith, find greater meaning and purpose, and develop a closer relationship with God.

If you want to adopt a new practice for Lent, there is still time! Lent is a great time to engage in your faith. You could commit to reading a Lenten devotional each morning or reading through one of the Gospels. If physical activity better suits you, consider taking a walk each day and spending the time in silence or prayer. I encourage you to try something new to create a meaningful Lenten experience.

Volunteering is a true family affair with this family. Below, Donna shares the wide-ranging list of organizations and opportunities she and her family have a passion to help.

"As a family, we have volunteered with Family Promise in various ways, including bringing meals, providing table decor, and breaking down after the families leave."

Donna and Piper enlisted a group from Donna's work to sort clothes at Foster Care Support Foundation in Roswell. This wonderful charity provides free clothes, toys, and baby gear to families who are fostering without benefit of government support. Often, it is grandparents on fixed incomes who are fostering grandchildren.

Piper, Donna, and Mia volunteer sorting books for the SSEF (Sandy Springs Education Force.)

Piper will be a Leader-in-Training at Camp High Harbour Lake Allatoona this summer.

Donna stays involved with the Walton Orchestra (where her children attend school). In addition, she serves as the chair for their 115-home subdivision's Architectural Control Committee, a job no one wants because sometimes people have to be told (in the most tactful terms) that their proposed changes are in poor taste. "While no one wants this job, most residents are extremely appreciative that the committee is ensuring we maintain neighborhood standards. This job takes about an hour a week."

And of course, Dad Jeff, is always behind and supportive of his volunteering ladies, helping where needed, transporting the girls where and when needed and often assists Piper when changing the Outreach Bulletin Board each month. Piper serves on the Outreach Ministry Team and assists with designing, creating, and changing the Outreach Bulletin Board at the first of each month.

"Beyond our volunteering, we have a passion for helping disadvantaged children continue with post-secondary education. We have helped send multiple Chinese orphans to college or trade school, once they age out of the orphanage program. And we're proud to contribute to the Zambia post-secondary scholarship program. As I often say, "Where else can this amount of money make such a difference in someone's life?"



SESSION SUMMARY

Session Meeting Summary February 18, 2024

The MVPC Session met for its monthly meeting on February 18. Following are items of interest from this meeting:

- David Barclift noted that attendance at Fellowship activities is excellent. The recent pancake dinner had the largest number attending in years.
- The Senior Adult Ministry Team working with the Congregational Care Ministry Team and Emory Hospital is planning a workshop on healthy aging. The workshop date is tentatively set for August 25. The workshop will be open to the public.
- Several reports were heard by Session including a summary of the recent Presbytery meeting as well as a report of our church's annual financial review. The financial review committee recommends the church create a financial procedures handbook and do a review of insurance policies.
- Rev. Toney-Schmitt and Shari Freeman will begin offering a once a month worship service at Vernon Springs Senior Living in addition to the weekly Bible Study that already is done each week.
- Rev. Abernethy reported that road construction impacting our church campus will begin on February 27. This construction project will involve work on both Mount Vernon Highway and Johnson Ferry Rd. and will last approximately two years.
