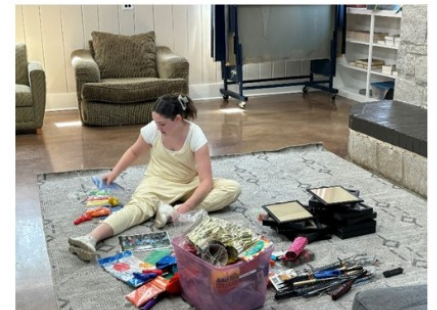


We received a thank you from Dr. Kathryn Threadgill, VP and Dean of Student Formation and Campus Culture:

CHRISTIAN VOCATION

What is our Christian Vocation?

I recently completed a questionnaire for the Presbyterian ordination process, and one of the questions asked was about Christian vocation. I suspect this question was included so that those in the ordination process could reflect on how God calls all of us to serve God and the Church, not just ministers.

“Christian vocation” means the call on Christians to live their lives as disciples of Christ. Presbyterians believe that we all have a vocation as Christians, which the Book of Order describes as “Honoring and Serving God at all times and in all places.” (W-5.0105) The protestant reformers Luther and Calvin emphasized that the Christian calling was not just salvation but service to the world as disciples of Christ. Calvin developed a doctrine of vocation emphasizing that our calling encompasses the entire scope of our lives, stating, “The Lord bids each one of us in all life’s actions to look to our calling.” This vocation includes our work lives, home lives, thoughts and actions, and private and public engagements with others, and the Holy Spirit empowers us with gifts to enable us to live out this calling.

What are your spiritual gifts? How can you use these gifts in service to God and the church? There are several different areas for ministry here at Mount Vernon – including music, worship, Christian education, outreach, witness, pastoral care, and fellowship. I encourage you to reflect on your own spiritual gifts and how you might live out these gifts and your calling here at Mount Vernon.

Outreach Ministry Team is taking a break from your regularly scheduled Volunteer Spotlight, to highlight an opportunity for you to get involved with one of our ministry partners.

Who are we Spotighting?

In May, we're spotlighting meals for Clifton Sanctuary Ministries. Clifton provides a transformational experience for homeless men through comprehensive life skills training, purposeful and assertive case management, collaborative community partnerships, and dedicated volunteers. Clifton is a Presbyterian-affiliated ministry and is the oldest house-of-worship shelter in Atlanta, operating 365 days a year. In addition to preparing and serving dinner each 3rd Sunday of the month, MVPC provides financial support and donations (sandwiches/sack lunches, gently used clothing, and paper products/cleaning supplies) throughout the year.



How can you help?



We need volunteers (individuals, families, or ministry teams) to prepare or shop for a hot meal and dessert for 20 men (ready to heat and serve). Some homemade or store-bought options include:

Each week we will delve into the cookbooks of MVPC past for a tasty fruity treat to enjoy! To get a head start, grab your MVPC cookbook off the shelf or enjoy these treats for Memorial Day Weekend!

Moma's Apple Cake

3 eggs	1 tsp. baking soda
1 ½ c. salad oil	2 tsp. vanilla extract
2 c. sugar	3 c. chopped apples (Granny Smith are best)
3 c. flour	1 ½ c. chopped pecans
1 tsp. salt	
Topping:	
1 c. brown sugar	1 stick butter
¼ c. milk	

Mix eggs, salad oil, and sugar and blend well. Add flour, salt and soda, mixed well. Add vanilla, apples, and nuts. Grease and flour pan. Put into greased 8 or 9 inch tube pan. Bake at 350° for 1 hour. While cooking, make topping.

Topping:
Combine all ingredients and cook 2 ½ minutes. When cake is removed from oven, poke holes in the cake with a toothpick or small fork. Pour topping over hot cake in pan. Let set until completely cool, and then remove from pan.

Banana Bread

4 ripe mashed bananas	1 ½ c. flour
2 eggs	¾ c. sugar
1 tsp. lemon juice	1 tsp. salt
Grated rind from ½ of a lemon	1 tsp. baking soda
½ c. bran flake cereal	¼ c. wheat germ
(if I use Rasin Bran, I don't mind if some raisins sneak in)	½ c. chopped nuts

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease and flour loaf pan. Beat together bananas, eggs, lemon juice and rind. Add cereal and let set for 5 minutes. Sift together flour, sugar, salt, and soda. Add sifted ingredients to banana mixture. Fold in wheat germ and nuts. Pour into prepared pan and bake for 1 hour (45 minutes if using 3 mini pans). Serves: 1 large loaf or 3 mini loaves.

Orange Blossom Muffins

Glaze (blend well):	
1 box powdered sugar	Juice of 1 lemon
Juice of 2 oranges	Grated rind of 1 orange
3 eggs	
1 ½ c. sugar	½ tsp. salt
¼ c. water	1 tsp. vanilla
¼ tsp. baking soda	¼ c. orange juice, fresh or frozen
1 ½ c. baking powder	1 ½ c. flour

Make glaze by blending sugar, oranges, lemon, and rind. Set aside. Beat eggs well. Sift dry ingredients and add alternately to eggs with liquids. Add vanilla. Fill small muffin pans ½ full and bake 10 minutes at 375°. While warm, dip in glaze. Place on wax paper. Makes 3-4 dozen small muffins. Be sure not to overbake. Can be frozen.

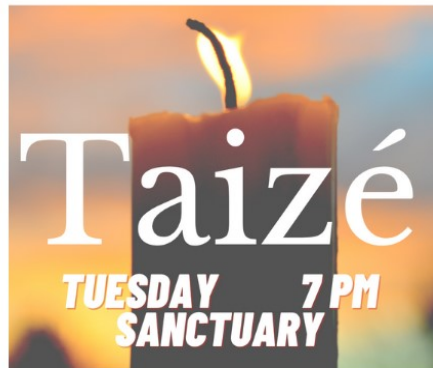

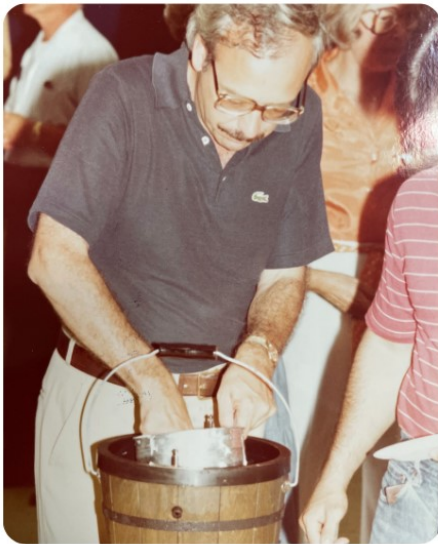

SESSION SUMMARY

Session Meeting Summary

April 21, 2024

The Session met for its regularly scheduled meeting on April 21 and conducted the following business:

- Planning for the 70th year celebration is in its final stages. May 19 is the date of the anniversary service.
- Years ago, MVPC created a small endowment fund at Presbyterian College to provide scholarships. This year's scholarship recipient is Thomas Hollingsworth from Spartanburg, SC. Thomas is a physics and history major.
- A note was received from Columbia Seminary thanking MVPC for helping restock the student food pantry.
- The Session welcomed back into membership Sharon Murphy.
- The Book of Order (the governing document of PC(USA) requires that each church do a yearly review of its financial procedures. The Session voted to ask Bruce Morine and Katherine Koops to conduct this review of the 2023 church year and report the results to the Session.
- As part of the implementation of the MVPC Safety Policy, a security officer has been hired to work three-hours on Sunday mornings with the responsibility of unlocking designated doors, assisting with car rider drop-off, and generally keeping an eye on things. A familiar face will be doing this work – Jason Locke who formerly was our church sexton will handle security and sexton roles.
- MVPC will be hosting the November Presbytery Meeting on our campus. Barrett recently met with Andy James, the Presbytery's Stated Clerk to begin the planning process for that meeting. Generally, several hundred Commissioners from the 80+ churches of our Presbytery attend these quarterly meetings. The Session will be asking for volunteers to serve in various capacities to prepare for and welcome Commissioners to our campus on Saturday, November 9.
