What's the Deal with the New Logo?

It's been whispered about in the pews since our wonderful 70th Anniversary service this past May 19 and I know you have driven past it while dodging the construction on both Mount Vernon and Johnson Ferry - I am of course talking about the new logo (above)! Several of you have looked at me blankly and said, "What is that?" Well, consider this your tutorial.

Where did the new logo come from?

We can thank our hard-working Mission and Ministry Team who have been gathering for over 2 years to discern how God is calling us in this season of ministry and how can we express that belief. They have and continue to spend hours deliberating about fonts, taglines, and logos. They have looked at numerous other churches and taken information that we, the church body, has offered through surveys and conversations.

What does it mean?

That is really up to interpretation. Officially, the Mission and Ministry Team are calling it a "star" but that is just one way to look at it. I would also invite you to look at in the same way we are called to look at the PCUSA Seal (pictured on next page). Looking at the seal, you can see a cross, a dove, a fish, a pulpit, a font, a Bible, and the flames denoting the Holy Spirit. Others have even noticed more symbols such as the Trinity within this seal.

Calendar/Birthdays Prayer Vine So what can we find with this Mount Vernon Presbyterian Seal? Of course, you can see the star as the Mission and Ministry suggests, but there is so much more:

1.Cross: This is at the heart of the seal. It represents the heart of our faith-Jesus Christ, the Crucified and Risen Lord.

2.The Star: often seen as a symbol of hope and usually connected to the story of the Magi who followed the star in the night to meet the newly born Christ- the savior had come into the world.

3.The Flower: the flower that blooms is often connected to Easter and resurrectional hope.

4.Butterfly: Much like the flower, the butterfly is also seen as a resurrectional symbol since much like Christ emerging from the tomb, the butterfly breaks forth from a cocoon.

5.The Fish: Have you noticed that each petal when connected to the cross in the middle makes the fish image. The earliest image for Christianity is the fish- as in we disciples are called to be fishers of people.

6.Reaching Out... to Welcome. Worship. Share. Serve.: Each petal/fish is a call for us at MVPC to live into our calling as disciples. The way we profess that spirit is to welcome, worship, share, and serve. How are you and how are we living out each petal/fish or platform for discipleship?

Admittedly, I struggle to see much more, but I am curious, what do you see? Keep looking at it- after all, it will be at the top of each bulletin going forward.



On June 2, we launch our "Summer Fruit" sermon series, which examines each of the Fruits of the Spirit from Galatians 5:22-23. The Fruits of the Spirit are listed in a section of Galatians that focuses on Christian freedom. In this section, the Apostle Paul warns against the "works of the flesh" and then encourages the Galatians to rely instead on the Spirit's power for experiencing true freedom. The Fruits of the Spirit, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control, sum up the attributes of a person or community experiencing freedom and living in accord with the Holy Spirit.

In addition to the Fruits of the Spirit, during this series we will highlight fruit-based desserts from the Mount Vernon cookbooks, the "Cherished Recipes" cookbook from the 1970s, and the 2004 "Sharing our Best" cookbook. Each weekly email will include a recipe from these cookbooks, and we will offer a taste of the recipe during the connections time before worship. The authors of the original recipes (or their children or friends) will prepare the recipes for each week. Hannah Hagenau: "Hannah's Zambia Fund"

"I feel lucky and blessed to help..."

Along with others from MVPC, Hannah is returning to Zambia this summer. This will be her third trip. Moved to help Zambian students continue their education on through high school and even beyond, Hannah initiated a campaign to fund tuition for students to attend Garden Hill. Below, she shares her story, how it started and grew and the amazing difference her commitment has made in the lives of so many.

"In 2015, I was starting 9th grade at MVPS and was looking for a topic for my iProject. iProject was a yearlong project that each MVPS high schooler was required to do, but they could choose to do anything. Before the school year started I attended a meeting with members of the church who had just returned from Zambia. My parents had gone previously and my confirmation project was fundraising for soccer nets for the local girls tournament, so I was already familiar with our church's work there. The returning members told us they had learned on their trip that many graduates of Garden Presbyterian School could not afford the tuition at the local high school, Garden Hill, and that any free schools were too far to travel. I was moved by this story and convinced two of my friends to help me come up with a solution to the problem. Ultimately, we decided to fundraise to pay for the student's tuition beginning in the 2016 school year (Zambia's schools start in January). That first year we successfully paid the tuition of 14 high school students who had graduated from Garden Presbyterian. In 2024, the church and I are paying the tuition for 46 students. In total, over 260 scholarships have been paid for through the generosity of so many of our members. Several of the students that have been funded over the past several years have even been offered positions at elite private schools and several have gone on to college."

"I have been very blessed to have visited Zambia twice and am visiting a third time this summer. Being able to meet the students is what makes this project so special to me. I have always enjoyed being able to relate to them and find our shared experiences even though we are from different continents. Every one of these students is extremely deserving of a high school education and I feel very lucky that I am blessed to be in a position to help. All my gifts were there in the closet (and I got to open them before dinner!) My work friends in the client service department of BDA/BBDO gave me a surprise bridal shower. The third was right after my 24th birthday-I picked up John at D/FW airport and he wanted to go straight to our favorite Tex-Mex spot and all our small-group friends were there to celebrate!

What is your proudest accomplishment?

FAMILY. I'm proud of my daughters and their husbands, the people they've become and their accomplishments. I'm proud of my husband and of the many good things he does. Of course, I'm proud of our little granddaughter! I'm proud of our church family and the things we have done and are doing. But I can't take credit for these things, other than being a part of the working together for good. And it's almost always good!

What is your biggest fear?

My biggest fear is that I won't live long enough to use all of my craft supplies! I focused on work for 42 years while collecting them; now I want to use every piece of paper, stamp and die cut to make more greeting cards for friends and family.
