World Communion Sunday was first celebrated in 1933 at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA as an attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity. Once World War II started, this ritual grew in importance and is still celebrated by Christians across the globe.

language, became popular in

American churches in

the 1990s, but it's roots date

back to the early 1950s. It

is called a "zipper song"

whereby the lyrics consist

of one phrase,

repeated with permutations.
