On the other hand, our location in the center of a bustling community has led to several physical alterations of our campus. Acknowledging these changes, we have spent this fall "Planting Trees" in worship as we recognize the need to replant where our landscape has been uprooted while studying how this biblical metaphor roots us firmly to God in Christ. It is from this inspiration that we are calling this year's Stewardship Campaign Sowing Seeds in Faith.

1. We have welcomed Jill Hudson and Rev. Jonathan Freeman whose musical gifts allow us to live into the modern worship service we offer by blending our traditional roots with contemporary elements.

2. We have celebrated as Shari Freeman graduated from Columbia Seminary and has transitioned from Intern to Director of Spiritual Care. In this new role, she has improved our pastoral care for homebound members and envisioned new ministries with senior adult living facilities.

3. More people continue to utilize our campus as a hub for spiritual and intellectual knowledge. Recently, our Senior Adults collaborated with Emory's Alzheimer's Research Faculty to bring 180 community members together to gain insight into healthy aging. 4. Over the last year our Children's Ministry has seen greater participation on Sundays, and we have developed a consistent Young Adult Ministry that comes together for Small Group studies and off campus fellowship events.

5. We were able to make the first churchwide trip to Zambia in more than 5 years.

OUTREACH



Ten years ago the Zambian College Fund was established by Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church to educate deserving students in an effort to break cycles of poverty, hopefully changing the trajectory of their lives for generations to come. According to recent studies, 70% of children in Zambia live in poverty with over 1.2 million children identified as orphans. These are the young people that we hope to reach with this program. These deserving students are able to continue the hard work they have completed in High School and begin to realize the dreams they have of being teachers, pharmacists, engineers, doctors, and more.

In the past ten years, 17 students have graduated from various programs and 15 students are currently enrolled. The first student who completed her education is Cecilia Mvulva. She graduated from the Helen DeVos Christian School (HDCS), ACE's main secondary school and did not have the means to continue her education. The Zambian College Fund awarded her a scholarship and she was able to complete her degree as a Clinical Medical Officer in 2017. Cecilia came back and volunteered at the high school she loved while she looked for a job in her field. In 2018, she was deployed by the Zambian government to be a Medical Officer in the Southern part of Zambia where she now serves her fellow countrymen in that capacity she says: "I have loved my work experience so far! Working directly with people when they are in need physically is both a call and a blessing. With God's help, I am able to have patience, understanding and confidence in my work! I am so grateful to you all for sponsoring me - here I am today, smiling!"

Lloyd Chama was the first of our Pharmacy students to graduate. Lloyd was raised in the Kanyama neighborhood where the Helen DeVos Christian School (HDCS) is located. His father was very sick and his mother couldn't afford to send him to school. ACE stepped in and Lloyd was sponsored through high school by a member at Mt. Vernon. When he graduated, it was a natural progression to award him a scholarship for college. Lloyd did very well in pharmacy school and now works for the government in rural areas in Zambia giving back to his community. He dreams of raising enough money to start his own pharmacy and eventually would like to go back to school and lecture in Chemistry.



ZAMBIA COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP FUND



Brighton Mambwe began his education in one of ACE's FaithWorks primary schools. After graduating from the Helen DeVos Christian School (HDCS), he earned his college degree in secondary education. Following graduation, Brighton started a career as a volunteer teacher at Helen DeVos Christian School. From January to December 2020, he worked as an intern for the Ministry of Youth and Sports. His commitment to education throughout the years led the Alliance For Children Everywhere Zambia to hire him as a teacher at the Helen DeVos Christian School, where he is currently employed.

Jack Mwale is a married father of two kids, he was one of the first pupils sponsored by ACE through Helen Devos School. He completed his Secondary Teachers' Diploma under ACE's sponsorship from 2013 to 2015, graduating in 2016. He started working for the Ministry of Education in 2017 as a secondary instructor. He went onto receive his Bachelor of Science in Education and currently, the scholarship program is helping him to get a master's in mathematics so that he can continue to achieve his dreams.



The current scholarship students are studying various subjects, including medicine, education, food production, pharmacy, fashion design and engineering. Pharmacy student, Jonah Mutambo shares: "I would like to specifically state that your continuous sponsorship and support has given me the resilience to carry on up to this far. As it would have not been easy for me to reach this part of a milestone with only hard work considering the current financial state and background of my family. It is my desire to do my level best in order to successfully complete my course so that I can in turn return the favor by helping people who would be in need of academic help in my community. Thank you!"

Thank you so much for your faithfulness in answering the call to care for orphans in their time of need. It is hard to express the true gratitude from the students whose lives have been changed by your generosity and response to their call for help. This is not an easy task but, as you consider how God may be calling you to sponsor further students, take heart. "He who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it" (1 Thessalonians 5:24).





SESSION SUMMARY

Stated Session Meeting Summary September 15, 2024

The following items of interest were addressed at the September Session meeting:

- The Presbytery of Greater Atlanta will host the fourth quarter Presbytery Meeting on the MVPC campus on Saturday, November 9th. The Session is asking for volunteers to sign-up to help with various responsibilities related to this meeting. People can use Sign-Up Genius or notify the church office. We expect about 300 people from across the Presbytery to arrive on our campus for this meeting.
- The Finance and Administration Ministry Team (FAMT) reports that member giving continues to be strong when compared to previous years. Collections are running about 15% ahead of schedule.
- The church and the city have finalized the transfer of land and funds related to road construction. Money received from the city will be invested until needed; FAMT is investigating the best ways to approach this investment.
- The annual Pumpkin Palooza event is coming up on October 20th. This year there will be a costume contest for adults get your costumes ready!
- The Session approved a Mount Vernon Foundation Grant for Garden Presbyterian Church in Zambia to build the roof for the church manse.
- The Facility Use Task Force has begun work to examine the various groups that use our campus and how we might better address campus security and building clean-up and maintenance related to use by outside groups. This task force will develop a Facility Use Policy.
