A Note From the Pastor

The Talk of Fall Sunday Mornings

Now that the calendar has turned to November we are in the throes of two different seasons. One of those is rearing its head somewhere in the background as you read this in the form of a political ad. The other is college football.

Since we are in polite company we are told to not talk about the former, but oh, do we love to talk about the latter come Sunday mornings this time of year. This past month, I was able to make a quick trip to the cathedral known as Bryant-Denny Stadium and there I met up with a pastor friend of mine who had never been to an Alabama game. If you have never had the privilege to take in this sociologial experiment, out in front of the stadium,

there are larger than life size statues of each coach who has won a National Championship for the beloved Crimson Tide. As we walked past these idols commemorating former glory, my friend asked, "How did this all begin? Why is this so important?"

The answer to this question is the 1925 Rose Bowl, the so-called "Game that changed the South." On that New Year's Day, Alabama did the unthinkable. They beat the mighty Washington Huskies, 20-19, delivering the first title for the team and ensuring the edifice of Coach Wallace Wade would forever tower over all who made the pilgrimage to Tuscaloosa. Today, we wouldn't think much of such a score

(of course Alabama would beat Washington), but back then this game had the capacity to change how people saw themselves as Southerners. For at that time, the south and football did not go together like peas and carrots. In fact, the south was the laughingstock of the gridiron.

Adding insult to injury, Auburn University Professor Wayne Flynt has remarked, "In 1925 the KKK amassed the largest membership in their history and the Scopes-Monkey Trial in Tennessee inspired New York based reporters to question the intellectual capacity of the Southerner." Hence, the conventional wisdom of a majority of Americans was that the south was a backwater, still reeling mentally, spiritually, and economically from the Civil War.

That's why that game on the first day of 1926 still shapes our Sunday morning fall conversations to this day. It's why Rev. Jesse Jackson told then LSU head coach Nick Saban in 2007, "Your team on a Saturday night in Tiger Stadium is closer to the kingdom of God than my church." That game nearly 100 years ago fostered a common identity. It's why when a southern team wins outside the region the fabled "S-E-C" chants emerge. The collective myth was created on that California winter day. The southern working man might have lost the war, might have been seen as backwards and racist, but he could say proudly, "Our boys can beat your boys."

Thankfully, I would like to believe, that much of that initial thinking has dissipated. I don't believe Rev. Jackson, a man who marched with King, would have seen such a vision of Tiger Stadium otherwise. Rather, today, what compels the narthex echoes of "Did you see that game?" each Sunday morning, or the chuckling, "Barrett, how did Alabama lose to Vandy?" comes from a place of shared identity rooted in a common connection forged over generations. It's why people who live in these parts but don't like football are forced to learn the pigskin parlance. Because it connects and allows us an opening to get to those deeper truths. Because beneath every Roll Tide or Go Dawgs is a longing to be a part of a communal identity. That's why, at its best, the fall Saturday is a gateway to the fall Sunday, because as these last 100 years have revealed, we long, through integration and opportunity, to see more and more welcomed to the table.

So while many, if not all of us, can't wait for the seasons that divide us to end, I hope you will relish the season meant to bring us together to celebrate competition, courage, and the inevitable conversation that comes after we say hello on Sunday mornings in the fall.

OUTREACH

Our October Communion Offering was treats for various schools' Trunk-or-Treat festivities. We also collected new & gently used socks for SOCKtober to benefit multiple outreach partners.

We solicited a call for items needed for Hurricane Helene relief in Ashville, NC and surrounding communities. Former church member Syliva McAdam visited church on October 13 to share a message and pick up the donations for delivery. In addition to our congregation's generous donations of diapers, wipes, and feminine products, OMT also used \$500 of undesignated funds to purchase those items as well as disposable hazmat coveralls, heavy duty rubber gloves, and respirator masks.





Senior Adults and friends met in October to prepare SSEF books for Trunk-or-Treat and fall festivals at local schools. We also used our local schools support fund to purchase new blankets to go in holiday baskets for Riverwood students whose families are homeless.

In November, our Communion Offering will be Thanksgiving food items for Stirred up Ministries and we will be promoting participation in CAC's Hope for the Holidays program (see our Volunteer Opportunity Spotlight also in the Good News).

The beauty of the woods leading the way, framing the frozen road's Winter journey, protecting the new beginnings of the day.


Worshipped before the Word was written,




