A Final 70th Hurrah!

"People, look east. The time is near of the crowning of the year!" We will sing these appropriate lyrics on December 8th as we make our Advent preparations for another joyful Christmas. I find these lyrics apt as we tie a bow on what has been an incredible year at MVPC. Together, we committed to celebrating 70 years as a church and we did so with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love. Let's recap:

In **January**, we leaned into our new tagline by preaching on the ideals of "Welcome, Worship, Share, Serve." After worship, you helped us by getting your picture taken as the process of creating a new church pictorial (our first in 12 years) began.

In **February**, we held our annual meeting in which we were excited to share that for the first time in a long time we could present a balanced budget that included a nearly 40% increase in missional giving from the previous year!

In **March**, we processed through Lent looking at the crosses we found on our campus, and concluded the season on the final day of the month by celebrating the resurrectional hope of Easter.

In **May**, we had that 70th CELEBRATION and 284 of our best friends attended! They all received a copy of the new pictorial and we unveiled our new church logo! It was a glorious day complete with former pastors and former members uniting with us to rejoice the past and envision a bright future.

In **June**, we started our Summer Fruit sermon series that enlivened our faith and our tastebuds! We also hosted the largest Los Niños Sunday ever as hundreds of children and their parents helped us celebrate 24 years of our partnership.

In **August**, we welcomed friends from Emory Healthcare as we explored what Healthy Aging is and how we can embody practices that support physical, mental, and spiritual well-being. In **September**, we celebrated 25 years of the MVP Foundation and the more than \$600k it has given to various ministries. We also kicked-off our "70 for 70" Campaign which is raising (notice it's not too late to contribute!) \$140k for future capital projects on our campus.

In **October**, we palooza-ed with pumpkins and recognized the Saints with the Bagpipes for our final Outdoor service (we said goodbye to many loved ones this year who helped us thrive for many of those initial 70 years).

In **November**, we welcomed our friends from the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta (see photos throughout the newsletter)! It was a joyous day of recognizing our connection in Christ.

In **December**, we will conclude our Planting Trees sermon series with the Chrismon Tree, while giving thanks for how each of us comes together from different directions and different experiences of life to be molded by the potter who comes into the world to share the light.

What a journey of faith it has been this year. Thank you for all the ways you made this a memorable time at MVPC!


DeDe Callahan turned 99!



I would spend the whole day outside with my family. We could play games, sit by the fire, see a waterfall, hike or explore. As long as we are together, it's my favorite day!


What two radio stations do you listen to in the car the most?
