A Note From the Pastor

12 Years, 12 Lessons How To Be a Manager

This lesson might be the biggest difference between my first call and my second call. My first call, for those of you who don't know, was in Livingston, AL. The church had about 80 members and on average 40 people worshipped together each Sunday. I was the only full-time employee. We had a part-time office administrator who oversaw the bookkeeping as well, along with a rotating cast of musicians that would join us on Sunday mornings. Alas, I was largely on my own. I was 60 miles from the nearest Presbyterian Church and 120 miles from the Presbytery office.

There was an independent coffee shop in town, and most days I would set up my office there. I wrote many sermons, planned services, and offered impromptu pastoral care to any and all who walked in to get a cup of joe.

This is how I learned to be a pastor.

When Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church called me to be their next senior pastor, I knew I had learned the gifts to do the pastoral part of the job. What I had not learned, and what I did not know, was how to be a manager of a church. Learning this has been my biggest growing edge here at Mount Vernon Presbyterian.

This is what I have learned:

To be a manager begins with listening. It means slowing down on whatever ideas you used to run with in the coffee shop and rather sit in the conference room with your colleagues to debate ideas. I have learned that without this order, no trust can be built. Without this, the stress among the staff will rise and the richness of what can be accomplished is rendered void. I believe that it is no mistake that the sermon series like the Planting Trees one was well received because the worship staff and I have developed a healthy amount of trust.

To be an effective manager means understanding how each decision can affect another part of the ministry. What may be a great idea for one part of the church or for a specific ministry might not work for another part. It very much lives into the idea that we are one body with many members. To be a good manager of that body means that each part of the body is working effectively with the other. That is why Session retreats, staff retreats, committee meetings, and asking questions can be so valuable.

To be an effective manager means understanding what your fellow staff members value. If I want them to succeed, I need to hear their thoughts and questions. This, hopefully, will inspire motivation and excitement to be here. To do that, I know I need to check in with them every so often - both in a group

setting and one-on-one. We do annual reviews but beyond that we check in weekly during our staff meetings. This checking in goes beyond work items. We address prayer concerns and other matters. This humanizes our work and welcomes God's grace in the otherwise "daily grind."

Finally, to be an effective manager means to serve with mutuality. What this means is that I want our staff and congregation to feel mutually aligned. That we are listening to what the congregation values and how they see God working through our community and in turn that the staff feels valued by the congregation and sees purpose to serving God's people in their various roles.

Learning and witnessing this growth has been a struggle at times as I have seen how certain habits at one point in my pastorate are no longer helpful, but that has also been the beauty of knowing that I am growing both as a person and a pastor. It's a sign that the Holy Spirit has and continues to work through those around me. I believe this is due to the congregation identifying leaders, who then hire staff, who then are called to work together to learn and grow.

As you read this newsletter, you may find yourself at the beginning of Lent. Lent is the period of 40 days (46 if you include Sundays) that lead to Easter. Lent begins this year on Wednesday, March 5 (Ash Wednesday), and ends on Saturday, April 19 (the day before Easter.) During Lent, we are encouraged to consider our human condition, including sin and failures, and ponder the new life offered to us by Christ Jesus. These 40 days are an opportunity for growth in our faith through prayer, Scripture, spiritual discipline, and self-examination.

OUTREACH

The Outreach Ministry Team is thrilled by your very generous donations to the Community Assistance Center in January. We donated over 400 pounds of non-perishable food and toiletries as well as over 6000 diapers.



Utilizing 2024 year-end funds for our local schools, we donated a \$220 Amazon gift card for STEM supplies to Woodland Elementary School.

The church session voted to increase our Outreach budget, which will allow us to give increased financial support to all of our ministry partners, as well as adding two new lines for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and the New Church Development Commission's Emergency Fund. We will also be able to continue supplementing our Communion Offerings, Special Offerings, and support needs that come up at the local public schools.

The February Communion Offering was for Clifton Sanctuary Ministries. Carol delivered some of the donations and our montly meal, as well as leftover sandwiches from Session that were packed into sack lunches.



SESSION SUMMARY

Summary of the February 16, 2025, Stated Session Meeting

The Session met for its regular monthly meeting on February 6, 2024, and conducted the following business:


- The Worship Ministry Team (MT) has created a plan (called Loving Hands) for regular, on-going cleaning of the sanctuary to address cleaning that is not normally done by the custodial staff. Wood will be touched-up and polished, and cushions will be spot-cleaned and vacuumed. Two to three pews will be addressed each month.
- The Finance and Administration MT plans to set-up a committee to manage investment of bequeaths. Recently the church has received some large bequeaths.
- The Senior Adult MT is planning to open-up senior activities to all church members. Seniors take trips to cultural and historical sites, watch movies, visit local restaurants, and help sort books for our mission partner, Sandy Springs Education Force. All members will be able to participate in these activities.
- Two people were removed from the church rolls. Our denomination requires churches to keep rolls up-to-date, so when we can no longer contact people and have no information about them, Session votes to remove them from the rolls.
- The Session approved the nomination of a 2025 slate of officers for the Mount Vernon Foundation. This slate will be presented to the congregation for approval.
- The Session also approved two Session members to fill the two designated spots for Session members on the 2025
 Nominating Committee. Elected were Htet Nyunt and Keith Bumgarner. The congregation will fill the remaining
 three spots at the Annual Meeting on February.
- There will be a Called Session Meeting on March 30 as part of the Suitability of Call process which is part of the installation and ordination process. Shari Freeman is nearing the point at which she can be ordained and installed as a pastor (teaching elder). The Suitability of Call process is designed to assure that a particular candidate is suitable for a particular church.

The next Stated Session Meeting will be on March 16.


