A Note From the Pastor

Rev. Barrett Abernethy

12 Years, 12 Lessons

Taking a Break

As many of you know, my first call saw me serve the rural, college community of Livingston, AL. First Presbyterian, the church I served, had been incorporated in 1833 and throughout their 180+ year history pastors had come, and pastors had gone (they even had hired a guy in the 1950s who posed as a pastor only for it to be found out that he was actually a convicted felon and conman, but that's a story for a different day). I once did the math on every pastorate in the church's history and the average tenure came out to roughly 2.5 years.

The one man who broke the mold was Burnell Chaney. A New England born and bred Yankee, he would not have been on

your bingo card to be the one pastor that would serve this small, southern town for 20 plus years, but alas, the Lord works in mysterious ways. Long story short, he met a local woman, Patsy Derby, (*pictured above*) in Washington, D.C. while she was working for the LBJ Administration (she was a cousin of First Lady, Lady Bird Johnson) and a first date at the Watergate Hotel led to marriage and a 23-year ministry amid the piney woods of west Alabama.

Even though he and his family departed Livingston in 1992, the "old guard" around town still saw First Presbyterian as "Burnell's Church."

Rather than trying to avoid his shadow, I embraced it. “It’s still Burnell’s Church, I just work here now,” I would tell the locals. By that point, Patsy, his widow, had returned home, living in the homestead that her father had built after he became the first person from that region to ship pigs between there and Atlanta (he knew the folks here liked to eat bacon).

Patsy, more or less, became my informal advisor. As a young pastor, 60 miles away from the nearest PC(USA) Church, having someone like her was providential. After her husband’s death, she had gone to Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary (like I had) and so we could bond, and I could confide to her from time to time. One of the things she imparted to me was something that Burnell had told her during his term of service – which is the lesson for this month:

“Patsy, the best way to live in Livingston is every now and then you must get out of Livingston.”

As the years have passed, I know exactly what he meant. It’s not a negative comment toward the town or the people you serve, rather it’s a reminder that pastors, people who empty their cup of empathy and compassion, need to remove themselves from that place they serve from time to time. That sabbath is vital. This is a true statement whether you

live in rural Alabama or urban north Atlanta. I loved serving the people of First Presbyterian, Livingston, AL, just as I love serving you, the people of Mount Vernon Presbyterian, Sandy Springs, GA.

Mondays are supposed to be my “day off,” but the emails never stop. Pastoral needs never stop. Ergo the only true way to take time is to remove yourself. This is the time that allows for spiritual growth, to “see the forest for the trees.”

This is one reason why I love to travel. For me it’s not the destination, it’s the journey. I believe this is a universal truth no matter what your vocation. It’s a reminder that God transcends the place where you give of yourself and is also present where you can replenish, and in months like this one, I hope it’s also a reminder that such time is resurrectional. May we follow God this season and continue to seek new life so we can continue to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ.

We are grateful for the years our volunteers have served Family Promise and the many families our church has helped support through this ministry.

Leftover food from the congregational meeting/brunch was all put to good use! Anna Morine took the perishables to the food pantry at CAC and Carol Beckman froze remaining items (quiche, bacon, and cinnamon rolls) to pass along to Darrell Jones for Stirred Up Ministry to serve to unhoused folks living in "tent cities" in downtown Atlanta. The frozen items plus two packages of grits that they cooked were enough to serve 25 folks a nice hot lunch on March 18.

The March Communion Offering was for the Columbia Theological Seminary Student Food Pantry. Rev. Dr. Kathryn Threadgill, VP and Dean of Student Formation and Campus Culture led worship on March 23, providing a Minute for Mission about the seminary and food pantry.

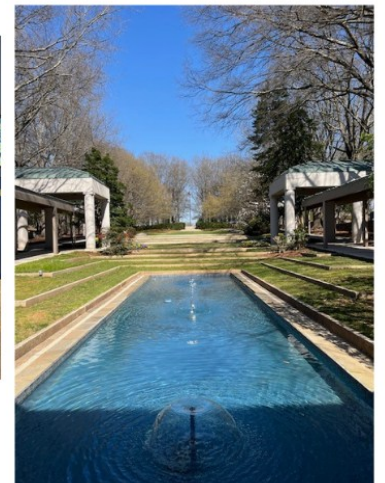




CELEBRATIONS

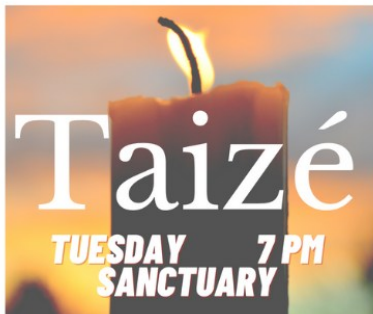

Thankful for Those Who Journey with Us

On Sunday, March 23, I attended the ordination of Dana AbuGhazaleh, a friend and classmate of mine from my years as a student at Columbia Theological Seminary. Dana and I both started seminary in the Fall of 2020. Our first year of seminary was all online because of the pandemic, and we met over Zoom on the first day of orientation. All incoming students were in the Zoom room, introducing themselves. They were from multiple states, including Georgia, Florida, and Michigan, as well as various countries, including South Korea, Kenya, Ghana, and Nigeria. Imagine my surprise when Dana introduced herself and said she was from Alpharetta, Georgia!

In addition to living only 5 miles apart, we had all of the same classes that first semester. Our Hebrew language class included a study group that met (over Zoom) every weekday at 9 am. Dana and I were both faithful participants in this study group, so I got to see and chat with her every day. She was a lifeline for me that first semester. Even though I was physically alone in my home office, I felt like someone knew me and what I was doing. We were even in similar places in our ministry discernment, initially unsure if we wanted to seek ordination, and we were both new to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)

Dana was a gift from God that first semester, someone to travel with me as I started on this new journey. And on March 23, I was thrilled to witness her ordination as Minister of Word and Sacrament at Alpharetta Presbyterian Church. Below is a photo of several of the Columbia students, graduates, and professors who were present at Dana's ordination. Dana is in the middle, wearing the robe and red stole. Thanks be to God for the friends that accompany us on new journeys in our life.

This photo also reminds us why supporting seminary education in general and Columbia Theological Seminary is essential. Included in this photo are future leaders in our church. People who have given up other careers to pursue a calling to ministry. Mount Vernon's support of Columbia, including outreach contributions to their student food pantry and participation in their community events, is an investment in the Presbyterian Church for decades to come.

SESSION SUMMARY

Summary of Stated Session Meeting Held on March 16, 2025

The Session met on March 16, 2025, for its regular monthly meeting. Following are the highlights of that meeting:

- Confirmand Samantha Fifield attended the meeting as part of her preparation for confirmation this spring.
- The Session discussed the PC(USA) *Book of Order* requirements regarding sexual misconduct, harassment, child and youth protection, and antiracism. The church has a personnel handbook and a child and youth protection handbook, but needs to review these handbooks and update them, if needed, and develop policies and handbooks related to ruling elders (Session members) since the PC(USA) policy now includes all church leaders. Over the coming months Session members and others in the congregation will work on policy and handbook development.
- The Session is working to define the words we use to describe our church (Reaching out to Welcome, Worship, Share, Serve). Definitions of these words are being created using a refinement process that began with brainstorming at the January Session Retreat; development of descriptive sentences at Session meetings; and finally, having the Ministry and Mission Team further refine and finalize definitions that will then be approved by the Session.
- Each year the Session must confirm that pastors are up-to-date on required Boundaries training. Both Rev. Abernethy and Rev. Toney-Schmitt are up-to-date as confirmed by the Presbytery.
- Since ruling elders are now required to go through Boundaries training, the Session watched a video developed by PC(USA) that meets this requirement.

Because of Easter, the next Stated Session Meeting will be held one week later than normal on April 27 in the Kirk Center.
