

Medical Emergency

- 1. **Immediately inform** an usher.
- 2. Determine if the person is breathing; if not, the AED device (defibrillator) must immediately be used (located in the lobby). The victim must be laid in the floor and AED instructions followed. Contact 911 & notify an usher if you have not already done so.
- 3. In the case of a **person passing out or falling**, once it is determined they are breathing, a decision must be made regarding the need to contact 911. Avoid moving the victim since an injury from a fall could be made worse through movement.
- 4. For minor injuries, a first aid kit is available in the lobby.
- 5. Do not crowd around a sick or injured person.
- 6. Some members of the congregation have medical training or CPR training. These people are available to assist.
- 7. Please get someone seated nearby to assist if you are feeling sick. Inform them of details of your condition.

Intruder Emergency

- 1. Ushers & security personnel are watchful as they greet people coming to church. They will be trained in how to recognize potential volatile situations.
- 2. Entry to the church is only through the main lobby doors. Once the service begins, these doors are carefully monitored throughout the service.
- 3. If there is a violent intruder who is able to enter the sanctuary, move quickly away from the person. A staff member or usher will contact 911.
- 4. If possible, leave through the nearest exit. If you are unable to leave, get under the pew.
- 5. If you are near that person, several people could attempt to stop the intruder. We hope this will not be necessary, but as a last resort would be advisable.
- 6. People in various parts of the sanctuary could make sounds to attempt to distract and/or disorient the person.
- 7. Once in a secure area, do not move from that area until clearly identifiable law enforcement officials indicate it is safe to do so.
- 8. Follow all instructions given by law enforcement.
